



















South Ayrshire Reads



Aug - Sept 25 (All primaries except Kirkmichael and Straiton)

- Baseline assessments on fluency and phonics to be completed across all primary schools.
- Teacher Input 1 with SAR Team Phonics.

Oct 25 - May 26

- Teacher Input 2 -Advanced phonics.
- Teacher Input 3 Fluency.
- Staff Evaluation Session review of progress
- Final assessments on fluency and phonics.

Ongoing

 Being Phase One SAR schools, Kirkmichael and Straiton Primary staff to model and share SAR experience other primary schools.

P7 Writing Transition



Aug - Dec 25

- South Ayrshire Leads from each school, including Principal Teacher of English at Carrick, to make connections and review:
 - Writing pedagogy across cluster
 - o Approaches to writing assessment
 - Moderate quality of writing

Jan - Apr 26

 Leads to develop a cluster vision for writing and develop a P7/S1 transition plan for writing.

May/June 26


 P7 Transition programme to be carried out across the cluster and included in authority P7/S1 transition days.

Science, technology, engineering and Numeracy



Aug - Oct 25

- Reintroduce STEM working party with representation from all cluster schools and with a mix of staff teaching at various stages and levels.
- STEM leads to meet and review TAPS resource and SSERC planners, looking to align more closely to shared cluster pedagogical vision and relate to meta-skills.

Oct 25 - May 26

- Lead staff member to work with Carrick Cluster Science Leads
 - Support cluster staff to use SSERC topic planners and further develop interdisciplinary learning with a science focus.
 - Develop 'Thinking Classrooms' with science used to support numeracy and develop contextualized learning opportunities.
 - SA Numeracy Lead to continue supporting all schools in the cluster to develop number sense and teach applied maths as part of the 'Thinking Classrooms' approach..

Ongoing

 Continue to provide contextualized learning experiences to prepare children for the world of work, relating to Meta-skills and wider cluster vision.

Meta-skills & Profiling



Aug 25

 My World of Work Profiling tool introduced at P5/6/7 across all cluster primary schools.

Sep 25

 Cluster Twilight to underline cluster vision and set aims for session, with specific feedback from working parties.

Aug 25 - May 26

- Staff across cluster to highlight meta-skills during all learning experiences and use to support stakeholder interactions.
 - Meta-skills posters displayed across Carrick Cluster Schools.

Ongoing

- Continue to provide contextualized learning experiences to prepare children for the world of work.
- All schools to utilise local businesses and groups to support learning and work place experiences.

Cluster 3-18 PE Programme



Sep 25

- New Cluster PE teacher appointed.
- Timetable created for PE teacher to visit cluster primary schools and model PE delivery, initial focus on second level.
- PE survey completed by all primary staff.

Sept 25 - May 26

- Carrick Cluster PE Skills Framework reviewed across session with Meta-skills highlighted as appropriate.
- CLPL offered for Primary staff to upskill PE delivery.
