

Attendance

Improving attendance is a South Ayrshire and school priority. Last session in South Ayrshire Primary schools, just over 37,000 days (the equivalent of over 220,000 teaching hours!) were lost to unauthorised absence.

Poor attendance has been linked to lower levels of attainment, peer relationships, emotional and behavioural difficulties and poorer employment opportunities, which is why we want to see **Every Learner Every Day!**

Please try to avoid booking term time holidays if you can as this affects attendance and your child will miss learning.

We follow the <u>South Ayrshire Council policy</u> on attendance and if your child's attendance falls below 90%, we will issue a letter to alert you to this and to offer support to try to improve this.

If your child is going to be absent from school or the EYC, please contact the school office on **01292 473456** or email **Monkton.mail@south-ayrshire.gov.uk** as soon as is possible in the morning of the absence. Please **do not message on Instagram or Learning Journals** to inform us of an absence as we cannot guarantee that this will be read / accessed each morning.

Respectful Relationships at Monkton

At Monkton, we have high expectations in relation to behaviour. We have a clear and structured Respectful Relationships policy within the EYC and school. As a Gold Rights Respecting School, we will continue to embed our school charters and each class has created individual class charters to ensure that everyone has shared high expectations across the school and EYC. Our expectations are discussed and reinforced within classrooms, the playground and at weekly assemblies. The aim is always to encourage children to take responsibility for the choices they make in relation to the way that they behave. As you will appreciate, some children's perception of situations does not always match that of others. In August, we sent out a parent guide detailing this policy with the newsletter and asked you to discuss the expectations with your child - Respectful Relationship policy.

Where some children require extra support for literacy or numeracy, other children may require enhanced support to help them to regulate their emotions and behaviour. Our nurturing staff are trained to support this. We live in a very diverse society, where some children have experienced trauma or are diagnosed as having ADHD or Autism. These children will be nurtured and supported by the entire Monkton Community to achieve their fullest potential, whilst also being supported to learn to take responsibility for their actions. We thank all parents / carers for showing a great awareness and understanding of this. We are well supported by the local authority with this, as we all work together to ensure equity and that "In Monkton, everyone is included!" (one of our aims).

This year as part of our School Improvement Plan, we are reviewing the Respectful Relationship policy and our <u>Anti-Bullying policy</u>. At our parents' evening and afternoon next week, we will be asking for feedback from you for both these policies so please take the time to give us your views. Their will be a stall outside the hall for you to do this. Thank you!

If you have any class based / individual pupil concerns, please contact the office to arrange to talk to your child's class teacher or EYC key worker as first point of contact. In some circumstances, you may wish to talk to -

•Mrs Miller if your child is in EYC, P1, P2 or P3 or Mrs Ramsay if your child is in P4, P5, P6 or P7.

Please **do not email class teachers, HT or DHT directly** as they may be out of school with no access to emails. Instead, please contact the school office to make an appoinment or email the school mailbox with your enquiry. It will be passed on and they will respond to you during school hours usually within 5 days.


