Sign Up to Parentsportal

Monkton Primary School and Early Years Centre recently went live with Parentsportal and we currently have a 51.15% uptake. We are keen to encourage as many parents as possible to sign up to this new system to fully achieve the benefits offered. Parentsportal provides a secure digital solution to the traditional school bag run, making it easier for parents and carers to manage paperwork connected with school activities, allowing them to obtain information about their child's educational progress at a time that suits them. This will include access to information such as Annual Data Packs which can now be offered online, consent forms, parental reports, pupil timetables, school calendar, school notices, etc as well as providing links other useful sites, such as Parent Pay, South Ayrshire Council website, and more. We will also be introducing additional services to the platform during 2024.

How to access Parentsportal


1. Download the parentsportal.scot APP using the QR codes (picture beside)

OR visit <u>https://parentsportal.scot/home/</u>.

2. Log in to Parentsportal using **'my account'**. If you already have a mygovscot **'my account'** click the link to **Sign In.** If you don't have a mygovscot **'my account'** click the link to register for this in the first instance, and then sign In.

3. Once registered you will be prompted to **'Link Your Child'** where you can provide details relating to your child. Once the details are matched you will be sent a security code to either your mobile number or email address registered with the school. The security code is to provide additional security before your child's record is linked. Your request will then be sent the school for approval and you will be notified of the decision to approve the link on your email.

4. The details added must match the information held within the school or a match may not be found. If anyone has any issues, please contact the office who will be able to provide assistance.

Learning, Teaching and Assessment (UNCRC Articles 28 and 29)



National Standardised Assessments for Scotland (NSA) and GL Assessments - P3 and P6

This month, all P1 children will complete National Standardised Assessments (NSA) with their class teacher. P4 and P7 have already completed these back in November. In August 2017 Scottish Government introduced the NSA, a single, nationally developed set of standardised assessments for aspects of literacy and numeracy, designed to align with the way we deliver education in Scotland through Curriculum for Excellence. All children in P1, P4, P7 and S3 are assessed once a year (using NSA) in aspects of reading, writing and numeracy. In addition to NSA, ongoing and informal assessment continues to be a central part of everyday assessment in schools. The NSA assess aspects of reading, writing and numeracy with diagnostic information on children's progress in these areas. Children complete the assessments online and they are marked automatically. This gives teachers immediate diagnostic feedback that they can use to help children progress in literacy and numeracy.

P3 and P6 children will also complete GL assessments this month, also for Literacy and Numeracy. These are also standardised assessments which the authority has requested that schools do to clearly identify progress and next steps for each child. Like the NSAs above these will be completed online, in class, with their class teacher.

Next Year's class structure and staffing

We can confirm that our class structure for next session will consist of 7 classes – P2/1, P2, P3, P4, P5, P6 and P7. This is the first time that we have had a composite class in the school for a few years but it is common in schools and used to happen in Monkton every year in the past. Their is a low intake of P1 children this coming year and as you know, our current P1 class is big which is why their will be a composite class. The P1 teachers will work closely with the HT / DHT when forming the composite class, taking social friendships and academic progress into consideration. We are currently working with the local authority to finalise our staffing for next session. We are unlikely to have our teaching staffing confirmed until late May therefore it is likely that we will be unable to share our final plans with parents / carers until June - probably just before the bump up afternoon on 12th June 2024.

Congratulations to Mrs Hogarth who will be leaving the school at the end of June 2024 as she has secured a new post as Principal Teacher of Early Years within the authority. We are sad that she is leaving Monkton but we wish her all the best in her new role!

It will be passed on and they will respond to you during school hours usually within 5 days.


