Updates (UNCRC Article 17)



This section contains important updates and information.



- On Tuesday 4th June 2024, we plan to hold our school and EYC Sports Day at 1:30pm, on the playing fields behind the school.
- All EYC P7 pupils will take part in 2 races each one flat race and one novelty race. Fly High are also going to join us and do two races for their children. We will also have a toddler race and a parents race at the end for those who would like to take part.
- Parents are welcome to come along to watch the races, from **1.30pm**. Please stick to the spectators side of the field (the side furthest away from the school). All children will remain with their classes in their designated areas.
- At the end of the day, all children will return into school where they will be dismissed at 3pm, following normal routine. Children should not be removed from the playing field area.
- If possible, P1-7 children should wear something with their house colour on it however, please do not go out and spend money on something new.

- Please ensure that your child wears suitable sports clothing and footwear for the day. They should bring water, a waterproof jacket, sun hat and wear sun cream (if weather is nice).
- If the weather is very wet or the ground is very wet following rain the previous evening or in the morning, we may need to risk assess and take the decision to cancel on the day. We will avoid doing this unless absolutely necessary and will inform parent / carers asap if we do.

Sign Up to Parentsportal

Monkton Primary School and Early Years Centre recently went live with Parentsportal and we currently have a 73.94% uptake. We are keen to encourage as many parents as possible to sign up to this new system to fully achieve the benefits offered. Parentsportal provides a secure digital solution to the traditional school bag run, making it easier for parents and carers to manage paperwork connected with school activities, allowing them to obtain information about their child's educational progress at a time that suits them. This will include access to information such as Annual Data Packs which can now be offered online, consent forms, parental reports, pupil timetables, school calendar, school notices, etc as well as providing links other useful sites, such as Parent Pay, South Ayrshire Council website, and more. We will also be introducing additional services to the platform during 2024.

How to access Parentsportal


1. Download the parentsportal.scot APP using the QR codes (picture beside)

OR visit https://parentsportal.scot/home/.

- 2. Log in to Parentsportal using 'my account'. If you already have a mygovscot 'my account' click the link to Sign In. If you don't have a mygovscot 'my account' click the link to register for this in the first instance, and then sign In.
- 3. Once registered you will be prompted to 'Link Your Child' where you can provide details relating to your child. Once the details are matched you will be sent a security code to either your mobile number or email address registered with the school. The security code is to provide additional security before your child's record is linked. Your request will then be sent the school for approval and you will be notified of the decision to approve the link on your email.
- 4. The details added must match the information held within the school or a match may not be found. If anyone has any issues, please contact the office who will be able to provide assistance.



We have been made aware of some of our pupils mis-using social media, particularly What's App, Snapchat and Tik-Tok. This is all happening out with school but unfortunately sometimes make their way into the school and cause issues, which then takes up an unproportionate amount of time in dealing with this. During assemblies and through class lessons, we have been talking to the children about Internet Safety and using phones / tablets safely however, we need your help to reinforce this message at home. We really cannot stress enough the importance of managing what your child is doing on their phone and how often they use them. Apps such as TIKTOK, SNAPCHAT are for children aged 13+. These age restrictions are in place because generally primary school children can be exposed to things which can damage their mental wellbeing and self-esteem. Thanks for your continued support with this - we do appreciate it is tricky because of peer pressure to be on these apps, but would urge all parents to consider the risks these pose. Thank you!

Next Year's class structure and staffing

We can confirm that our class structure for next session will consist of 7 classes – **P2/1**, **P2**, **P3**, **P4**, **P5**, **P6** and **P7**. This is the first time that we have had a composite class in the school for a few years but it is common in schools and used to happen in Monkton every year in the past. Their is a low intake of P1 children this coming year and as you know, our current P1 class is big which is why their will be a composite class. The P1 teachers will work closely with the HT / DHT when forming the composite class, taking social friendships and academic progress into consideration. We are still working with the local authority to finalise our staffing for next session and we were interviewing for teaching staff last week. We will share our final plans with parents / carers as soon as we can, probably just before the bump up afternoon on 12th June 2024.



Next school session, we will continue to open both gates in the morning and at the end of the day as the rear entrance is handy for those who live at the top of the village e.g. Fairfield and it reduces some of the congestion at the front of the school. Therefore, pupils will be able to enter the playground from whichever gate suits best from where they live / are dropped off.

The front and back gates will open at 8:50am each morning. All pupils will enter the school building at 9am each morning.

There will be one morning break for all P1-7 pupils from 10:30 am – 10:45 am.

There will be one lunch time for all pupils from 12:30 pm - 1:15 pm. There will be a rota in operation with some classes going into the hall for lunch first and others going outside to play before being called in.

Home time will be 3pm each day. P1-3 pupils should be collected from front gates where possible (unless prior arrangement). P4-7 pupils can choose to leave via the front or back gate.

The EYC doors will open in the morning from 8:55-9:10am and be open for pick up between 2:45-3pm.

There is a breakfast club that that is operated by Fly High from 7:45am – 9am each morning in the school dining hall. More information on this can be obtained by phoning (01292) 475360 or emailing info@flyhighearlylearning.co.uk.

The wearing of school uniform is very much encouraged at Monkton and we would like every child to wear full uniform to school every day.

Our uniform consists of:

White or pale blue polo shirt or shirt and tie

Black skirt, pinafore or trousers

Blue tartan skirts or pinafores (if preferred)

Royal blue sweatshirt or cardigan

Black blazer or blue checked dresses (in summer)

To avoid loss please ensure that all your child's clothes and belongings are clearly labelled with their name.



The school will provide all children with a book bag to carry their reading book and any items of homework. They may wish to bring a school bag too but it is not a necessity. Children will receive a homework diary.

In class, we do encourage the children to drink plenty of water, so please provide them each day with a filled water bottle. Children will not be permitted to drink flavoured water or juice throughout the day – only at break or lunch time. We do not allow fizzy juice, chewing gum or nuts (or nut products). Children can bring one small, healthy snack for break time – a piece of fruit, cereal bar or crisps would be best. We do not recommend sweets or sugary snacks. Children in the EYC will be provided with snacks and drinks (milk and water) therefore there is no need to bring any food or a water bottle to the EYC.

Children do like to bring their own pencil case to school, but this is not compulsory as the school will provide stationery.

A gym kit should be provided for your child. This should include:

Slip on or Velcro black gym shoes, Shorts, White or pale blue t-shirt or polo shirt, Jogging trousers / leggings (for outdoors)

Children should keep their gym kit in a drawstring style, gym bag in August for them to keep their P.E. kit in. This bag can be left in the classroom, ensuring that the child has their kit available at all times. Please ensure that **all items have your child's name on them** before they are brought to school. You may wish to purchase Name Tag labels below.

Do you find your children lose uniforms and water bottles at school? Order name tags to reduce your losses and help support our parent council at the same time.

We have signed up with My Name Tags which means that every order that is placed using our school ID the parent council get a percentage which supports our fundraising efforts.

We all know the frustration of lost jumpers, hats, juice bottles and sometimes even shoes. My Name Tags are dishwasher proof, washing machine proof and can be personalised.

It will be passed on and they will respond to you during school hours usually within 5 days.
