What are we learning this term?

Cross-curricular themes: 'Fairtrade' then 'Recycling'

<p>Literacy and English (UNCRC Articles 13 & 28)</p>  <p>We will continue to develop our phonics skills using strategies to help us read and spell new words. In reading, we will use our knowledge of punctuation and grammar to help us read with more fluency, understanding and expression. We are beginning the session with a block of narrative writing. We will be considering how to improve our stories by developing the setting and characters through our word choice and descriptions linked to our senses.</p>	<p>Social Studies (UNCRC Articles 15, 14, 28 & 29)</p>  <p>Our main topic to begin with this session is Fairtrade. We have already completed a class consultation and planned our learning which will focus on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * learning about and researching Fairtrade products * farmers and their work * the future of Fairtrade and how we can help. <p>We will be reading 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory' as our class novel in and will link this to the story of chocolate and Fairtrade.</p>	<p>Health and Wellbeing</p>  <p>During Health & Wellbeing time, we will focus on the importance of feeling and being safe in different situations. Further to this we will explore the values of friendships in and out with school. We will develop our awareness of healthy eating through our Fairtrade topic. (UNCRC Articles 15, 19 and 24).</p> <p><u>P.E.:</u> In PE, we will be reinforcing teamwork and co-operation skills through a variety of possession games. We will develop our understanding that physical activity develops fitness. (UNCRC Article 15).</p>	<p>Religious and Moral Education (UNCRC Article 14)</p>  <p>To begin with, we are going to be learning about the story of 'The Lost Sheep'. We will be discussing the key points from the story and how we can help others at home, in school and our local community.</p> <p>In term 2, we will be exploring foods and festivals from different religions.</p>
<p>Numeracy and Mathematics (UNCRC Article 28)</p>  <p>We will be developing our skills in:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Place Value - working with larger numbers * Estimation and Rounding * Number - Adding and Subtracting two-digit numbers * Properties of Shape <p>We will continue to develop our mental maths strategies through Number Talks, Big Maths, whiteboard games, table top games and other activities.</p>	<p>Technologies</p>  <p>During our ICT lessons, we will learn to log on and off independently using our own usernames and passwords. We will be discussing the importance of never sharing passwords for security. We will become more aware of the keyboard and using caps lock, space bar, the enter key etc. Through our topics, we will begin to use the Internet to search for information.</p>	<p>Sciences</p>  <p>We will be exploring topical science topics through our topic of Fairtrade. Further to this, we will have a focus on recycling. We will be exploring why we recycle as well as the various recycling processes for different items. We will be finding out about the recycling bins we have at home and further opportunities for recycling in our local community. We will develop an understanding of how recycling helps the environment and people around the world.</p>	<p>Expressive Arts (UNCRC Article 29)</p>  <p><u>Art:</u> We will be using a variety of art techniques to take part in activities related to our topic as well as seasonal changes as we progress through the term.</p> <p><u>Drama:</u> We will develop our role play skills through our topic by acting out some scenes from 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory'.</p>
