Literacy and English



In reading, our class novel study will be 'Holes' and we aim to develop our reading comprehension strategies and reading fluency. Our novel links to our topic this term as it highlights how unfair punishment and abuse of power threaten justice, highlighting democracy's need for fairness and accountability.

Pupils will also be encouraged to read for enjoyment through our Accelerated Reading programme. (Article 2, 22, 29 and 38)

Using our novel and topic, pupils will experience writing across a range of genres and weekly spelling and grammar lessons will also be completed.

Social Studies



This term, our main topic will be linking Democracy and Crime and Punishment. We will be looking at the role of both the Scottish and U.K. Parliament.

Through the topic, we will develop our understanding of democracy and the work of politicians at local and national level.

We will start the year off by creating our own political campaigns and speeches for House Captains.

Health and Wellbeing



We will focus on making positive choices in relation to healthy lifestyles, behaviour, and friendships. We will also be starting LEAN's neurodiversity programme which empowers diverse thinkers, promoting inclusion, fairness, and equal opportunities through education, support, and workplace awareness.

P.E. is on a Wednesday and Thursday with a focus on possession games such as Hockey as well as team building exercises.

This term, Primary 7 will be learning about Saint Andrew, the patron saint of Scotland.

Pupils will learn about the links with Scottish history and culture. They will also explore how Saint Andrew's Day is celebrated and plan their own celebrations.

Numeracy and Mathematics

Pupils will



continue moving

mathematics. Mental maths will
continue to be a strong focus with
strategies being taught to develop
