What are we learning this term?

Cross-curricular theme: 'China' and 'Wildlife and Habitats'

Class: Primary 5

<p>Literacy and English</p>  <p>We will continue to develop our phonological awareness and apply this within all literacy activities. We will continue to develop our reading and comprehension skills through reading non-fiction texts this term. In our writing, we will learn to organise information into a variety of formats such as recounts, reports and letters. We will review and correct writing to ensure it makes sense, is technically accurate and meets its purpose. We will also learn about Scottish language and poetry.</p> <p>Article 13 and 29</p>	<p>Social Studies</p>  <p>This term our topic is 'China,' we will learn about people and place. We will learn about Chinese culture and food, exploring the festival of Chinese New Year. We will research different Chinese cities and compare these to our area. We will also investigate the physical geography of the country and learn about the environment in China. We will compare life in China to life in Scotland.</p> <p>Article 28</p>	<p>Health and Wellbeing</p> <p><u>P.E</u></p>  <p>We will focus on golf with Mrs Caird. We will participate in the 'Keep Driving' programme. We will also be attending swimming lessons every week and will participate in Bike ability in Term 4 to highlight cycle safety.</p> <p><u>Health and Wellbeing</u></p> <p>We will learn about resilience and our self-worth, developing skills to confidently talk about our strengths and recognise this is different for everyone. We will also learn about a balanced diet incorporating each food group.</p> <p>Article 3 and 31</p>	<p>Religious and Moral Education</p>  <p>In RME this term, we will learn about the Bible and the Torah</p> <p>We will also focus on the celebration of Easter.</p> <p>Article 14</p>
<p>Numeracy and Mathematics</p>  <p>We will continue to develop mental maths strategies through our Big Maths programme and consolidate all learnt times tables. We will develop our ability to multiply and divide using a range of methods. We will learn to apply the correct order of operations in number calculations when solving multi-step problems. We will learn about measurement, in particular learning more about area and perimeter of shapes.</p> <p>Article 29</p>	<p>Technologies</p>  <p>We will learn to use a range of applications to develop our skills in inserting, sending and presenting information.</p> <p>Throughout the term we will also develop our understanding of engineering and take part in the Primary Engineering competition.</p> <p>Article 17</p>	<p>Sciences</p>  <p>We will be learning about Wildlife and Habitats. We will classify living things into groups. We will identify characteristics of living things and their environment which have contributed to the survival or extinction of a species. We will be able to describe how energy flows between plants and animals in more complex food chains.</p> <p>Article 6</p>	<p>Expressive Arts</p>  <p>In Art we will learn to use different media to make our own pictures e.g. designing our own tartan silhouette pictures to link to the Scottish Poetry Competition.</p> <p>Additionally, we will follow a step-by-step process to develop and communicate ideas in response to a design brief.</p> <p>Article 31</p>
