<p>Literacy and English</p>  <p>This term we will continue to learn new phonemes and will focus on prefixes to further develop spelling skills. We will build on comprehension strategies by reading unseen non-fiction texts. In our writing, we will learn to organise information and will write non chronological reports as well as persuasive texts. We will develop our ability to use some of the basic features of personal writing.</p> <p>Article 13 and 29</p>	<p>Social Studies</p>  <p>This term we will learn about Great Britain and the United Kingdom focusing on the geography of each of the 4 nations. We will learn about the differences and similarities between them. We will learn about local farming and understand the importance of the different types of agriculture in the production of Scottish food.</p> <p>Article 13</p>	<p>Health and Wellbeing</p> <p><u>P.E</u></p>  <p>In P.E. this term we will focus on further developing and building gymnastic skills. We will learn basic body shapes and rolls to improve the control we have over our bodies to join movements together seamlessly. We will also develop racket skills through tennis activities and lessons.</p> <p><u>Health and Wellbeing</u></p> <p>We will learn about the ways in which we can become more active daily. We will explore friendship and learn about the qualities of a good friend.</p> <p>Article 3 and 31</p>	<p>Religious and Moral Education</p>  <p>In RME this term, we will learn about the Hindu story of the Ramayana and discover how good overcomes evil. We will also focus on the celebration of Easter. We will learn about the symbols of Easter and their meanings.</p> <p>Article 14, 28 and 29.</p>
<p>Numeracy and Mathematics</p>  <p>We will develop mental maths strategies through our Big Maths programme and consolidate all 'Learn It's' to date. We will learn to understand multiplication and division and explore a range of strategies to determine facts and use our knowledge to explore fractions. We will develop our ability to tell time using both analogue and digital clocks. We will learn to calculate time durations.</p> <p>Article 29</p>	<p>Technologies</p>  <p>In technologies, we will learn to develop our skill in using Word documents and PowerPoint. We will improve touch typing and develop our skill in inserting, sending, and presenting information to others. We will develop our coding skills through use of microbit and sphero and learn how to create our own projects.</p> <p>Articles 17, and 28</p>	<p>Sciences</p>  <p>In science we will learn about the body and body organs. We will learn to recognise and identify some of the main bones of the skeleton and major organs of the body. We will take part in investigations about the reliability and limitations of the senses.</p> <p>Article 28</p>	<p>Expressive Arts</p>  <p>In Art, we will develop drawing and painting skills. We will learn to explore warm and cool colours and use appropriate materials for our work. We will have Mr Hill our music specialist to continue developing skill in using a variety of instruments as well as continuing to build on singing and body percussion skill.</p> <p>Article 31</p>
