Peer Assessment is useful as a plenary, as homework, or during a lesson to check that pupils can apply the skills they are using in a different context.

Pupils are asked, at a minimum, to complete two statements while looking at the work of a peer:

What went well...
Even better if...

This can be extended by asking the pupil to also complete the statement:

Next steps...

Opportunities to discuss and explain the work should be encouraged so that pupils learn from and support each other. Generic statements such as “nice drawing” or “all the answers are correct” should be discouraged.

A section for teacher comments could also be added to make this assessment mode more robust.

What is peer assessment?

Peer assessment involves you taking responsibility for assessing the work of your peers against set assessment criteria.

Why peer assessment?

Peer assessment enables you to give your peer valuable feedback so you learn from and support each other. It adds so much more to learning and the opportunity to talk, discuss, explain and challenge enables you to achieve more than you would on your own.

Hints:

- Remember to write in full sentences
- Write as many comments as you can especially when writing the what went well comment
- Be honest about the work you are peer assessing
