Rights Respecting Schools - Gold Reaccreditation Update

We are delighted to share that our school recently took part in our Gold Rights Respecting Schools reaccreditation visit, and it was an incredibly positive day. Our children, parents and partners have been working together to demonstrate our strong commitment to children's rights, and this shone through during the assessment.



The assessor was extremely impressed with our pupils' confidence, awareness, and passion for children's rights. Our young people spoke so well about their experiences, their learning, and the many opportunities they have to share their voice and influence school life. We are very proud of them!

Our ethos at St. John's was highlighted as a real strength, with special recognition given to how we empower our pupils to lead change and take ownership of their learning. We were thrilled that our Follow Your Own Friday approach was praised as an example of very good practice.

While the official results will arrive in December, we can share that the assessor has recommended St. John's for Gold reaccreditation for the third time running, a testament to our nurturing, inclusive and rights-respecting community.

A huge thank you to our staff, parents, partners and, of course, our wonderful pupils for their ongoing dedication, enthusiasm, and support on this journey. Together, we continue to build a school where every child feels valued, empowered, and heard.
