You could start planning this by drawing the beginning of the story, then the end of it and then draw the part in the middle. Try to use the actions that we have been using in class e.g. (Once upon a time, First, Next, After that, Finally, then end -"4 leaf clover my story is over") You could also record yourself if you like?
