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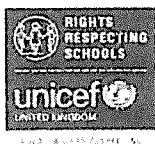

Dear Parent / Carer,

Bikeability Level 1 (P6 and P7) and Level 2 (P7 only) training will start in school on the following dates - **Wednesday 21st May, Friday 23rd May, Wednesday 28th May, Friday 6th June, Wednesday 18th June and Friday 20th June 2025.** The first session will be a bike safety check. The remainder of the course is designed to develop road sense, awareness of traffic hazards, and to improve your child's ability to ride safely.

During the course of the programme, your child may receive homework/literature to be completed at home, and your support in going through this with your child will help him or her develop road safety skills, knowledge and attitudes much more effectively.

Your child will need a bicycle in a roadworthy condition in order to participate in the course. It would be helpful if you could check the bicycle or take it to a cycle shop to be checked to ensure it is safe for use. Please refer to 'Parent's Guide' for further information. You must provide acceptable head protection for your child and suitable outdoor clothing should be worn. The Ayrshire Roads Alliance's Road Safety section will provide information about suitable high visibility clothing.

Part of the training (Level 2) will take place on the public roads. Your child will go through a process of assessment and will be continually assessed and monitored on their progress. At the end of their training he or she will be issued with a certificate and badge from Bikeability Scotland (Level 1 and Level 2). The certificate will give you a clear indication of how he or she has been graded on Observation, Safe Road Positioning and Signalling, highlighting areas that require further guidance.

Only the basics of safe cycling can be learned on this type of course, therefore, it is very important that you continue to provide road safety help and guidance to your child after the course.

South Ayrshire Council will not be responsible for damage or loss of a child's bicycle.

If you require further information regarding Bikeability please contact the school office. If you are able to offer your help and time as a parent helper through the bikeability sessions, it would be greatly appreciated.
