

- Continue to maintain polytunnel with support from local residents and families.


SESSION AIMS

- Use the SSERC planners and TAPS resources to plan exciting Interdisciplinary Topics.

This will take the form of Block Play, Outdoor Learning and Play Based Learning, and relate to key areas of literacy, numeracy and health and wellbeing.

South Ayrshire Reads







Numeracy



Aug - Dec 25

 Team-teaching approaches to be used across all stages and EYC to support returning staff with CPA approach, led by school Numeracy lead in collaboration with SAC Numeracy Lead.

Sep 25 - May 26

- Collaborate with SAC Numeracy Lead to develop a greater focus on numeracy through a Technology and Engineering lens.
- Make clear links between meta-skills and success with numeracy through 'thinking classrooms' work.

Science



Aug/Sep 25

 Reintroduce cluster STEM working party with 3-18 representation and set diary dates for session.

Oct 25 - May 26

- Lead staff member to work with Carrick Cluster Science Leads to:
 - Support cluster staff to use SSERC topic planners and develop interdisciplinary learning with a science focus.
 - Develop 'Thinking Classrooms' with science used to support numeracy and develop contextualized learning opportunities.
 - o Underpin meta-skills developed through STEM lessons.
 - Develop links with local farms, factories and businesses around science themes across the North Carrick area.

Enquiry-based Learning



Sep - Dec 25

- Review learning spaces both in and out of the classroom in line with adaptive teaching and CFE principles.
 - Audit resources and make any necessary purchases to improve environment.
- Visit other schools within South Ayrshire as suggested by South Ayrshire Learns team and further afield as recommended by HT work with national partners. Seek examples of best practice in relation to:
