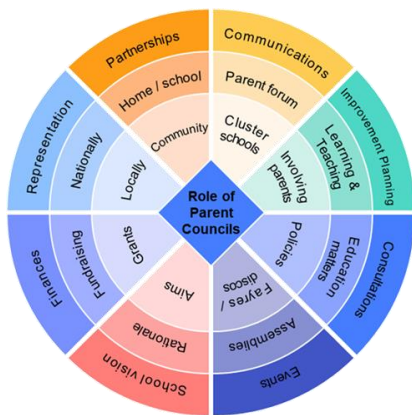
HANDY HELPERS
