Other topics we will cover are:

## Literacy

**Reading** – We have a very exciting adventure story for our class novel this term – called ‘The Good Thieves’ by Katherine Rudell. This is a fun adventure story, which I am sure pupils will love. We will spend time exploring characters, setting, writing summaries and working on answering a range of questions that require pupils to think more deeply about the text.

**Spelling** – Pupils continue to work through spellings in line with the South Ayrshire Reads progression. Pupils get introduced to different phonemes – getting the opportunity to encode and decode words, as well as exploring meaning.

**Writing** – this term we will continue to have weekly big writing sessions. In the second half of the term, we will be participating in the Creative Writing Project. We will be writing a story, learning to proofread and we hope to invite you in later in the term to share our books with you.

## Interdisciplinary Learning

This month, our learners are exploring how countries around the world are both unique and connected. Through hands-on activities, maps, and guided discussions, students are comparing cultures, traditions, geography, and daily life in different nations.

The goal is to help them build global awareness, appreciate diversity, and understand how people across the world solve similar problems in different ways.

Pupils will continue to engage in SMART target setting, encouraging pupils to have independence in their own learning and strive to reach their goals.
