Numeracy and Maths

During term four we will be covering:

- Fractions, Decimals & Percentages
- Time
- Measure
- Revision of the four operations in varying contexts

Literacy

Reading – This term Primary 5 will be reading ‘Kensuke’s Kingdom’ as their whole class text. We will work on building a deeper understanding of the text and developing our critical thinking skills through a variety of activities across the curricular areas.

Spelling – Pupils will continue to explore phonics through the South Ayrshire Reads programme, to enhance their phonological awareness. Pupils will focus on a different phoneme or base/root word each fortnight, and these will be studied in-depth within the classroom.

Writing – Pupils will begin the term with a focus on narrative writing as part of our creative writing project. They will plan and write their own imaginative story linked to our class theme, developing their ideas, characters, and settings. Once their stories are complete, the children will turn them into physical books, which they will share with classmates and proudly present to yourselves at the end of term. Pupils

Interdisciplinary Learning

Our topic work this term will begin with a celebration of Sir David Attenborough on the run up to his 100th birthday. We will investigate the impact of his life's work and create nature-inspired artwork for the Rita Cotter Art Competition.

We will then move onto a focus for Mental Health Week, where pupils will learn how to recognise emotions, understand the importance of wellbeing, and discover practical strategies for looking after themselves and supporting others.

After this, the class will begin a short geography topic comparing Scotland with Japan, investigating differences in landscapes, climate, culture, and daily life to build a deeper
