## No Dogs in the Playground

In this first term we have seen an increased number of dogs being brought to school at pick-up time. While our children are always happy to see their pets, this can be quite distressing for some youngsters and indeed pets, as youngsters cannot help but want to touch. This is especially when folks are being considerate and tie the dogs to railings on the grass verge whilst they collect a child. Owners, children and pets would be devastated if a pet lost patience and snipped at a child. For this reason, we politely ask that no dogs are brought to school at pick-up or drop-off and are **not allowed into the playground**.

## Bringing Bikes and Scooters to School

Please remind your youngster to refrain from riding their bikes/scooters when entering the playground in the morning and when leaving at the end of the day and to walk them in instead. This will ensure the safety of all our children and families at these busy times.

## Transition: Primary 7 – Secondary School

Already work is underway to make our P7 transition to secondary school as smooth as possible. Before too long you will be asked to complete paperwork online regarding your wishes for Secondary school — keep an eye on your email. We also work very closely as a cluster and with Prestwick Academy to help our youngsters and parents on understanding the curriculum. Transition events for this year will kick off with a numeracy event "Christmaths" on 4<sup>th</sup> December and a Cluster P7 Disco on the 11<sup>th</sup> at 6.00-7.30pm at Prestwick Academy.

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#### Attendance and Lateness

The local authorities across Scotland are monitoring very closely the attendance rates across schools as this is having a significant impact on learning for children. Post COVID the number of family holidays during term time has risen dramatically, coupled with children being genuinely unwell this can cause gaps in your child's learning. When totalled sometimes missing several weeks of schooling.



#### Medicines in School

Should medicine required to be administered at school then parents <u>must</u> complete the required documentation which is available from the school office. Any medication should be handed in to the office staff first thing in the morning and then collected at the end of the day. Children who require inhalers should be able to use these themselves, under the supervision of a member of staff.

#### Water bottles

We have a water cooler available for use by pupils in the school and classroom taps provide potable drinking water. However, we would ask that pupils bring their own water bottles to have in class (with the non-spill lid) for hygiene and cost. If you send your child to school with a filled water bottle, please ensure that it is only water in it. **No juice, please.** 

Our Eco-committee are also working hard to reduce the amount of single use plastic.

#### P.E. Kit

Please ensure that your child/children have their P.E. kit either in their school bag or bring it in a bag which will remain in school and be sent home termly. A P.E. kit should be a pair of shorts, t-shirt and white soled shoes. Children are not permitted to take P.E. in their school shoes.
