Literacy & English

We are learning to identify characters, sequence events and say what we think happens next in a story.

We are learning to control our pencil with correct grip and pressure.

Suggested Activities

- Read or listen to the suggested stories or a story of your own. Use the Early Reading Prompts to ask questions about the book.

- Pencil control learn to draw minibeasts. Copy the steps below.
- Continue to practise writing your name. Make a name caterpillar.
- MAKATON Mrs Law has recorded a video with Makaton signs for different minibeasts. Play a game of Minibeast bingo using the signs.

Numeracy & Maths

We are learning to explore symmetrical shapes in our environment. We are learning to create our own symmetrical pattern.

Suggested Activities

- Look for symmetrical objects in your home or when you are out for a walk.
- Create simple symmetrical patterns using Lego or bricks (see below).
- Create symmetrical butterfly wings using paper and paint or use the template provided (see below).
- Make playdough butterflies with symmetrical wings or make salt dough ladybird or butterfly decorations and try to paint the same spots or patterns on both sides.
- Ladybird Spot counting activity (if you can do this easily, make a number sentence and add instead e.g. '3+4=7 3 spots add 4 spots equals 7 spots') https://www.topmarks.co.uk/learning-to-count/ladybird-spots

- Friendship activity all children will be in groups or classes with some new faces as they move to pre-school or into primary 1. Use the friendship activity as a starting point for discussing friendship skills, or cut and paste the qualities into the sheet.
- Get ready for P1 by practising getting yourself dressed and undressed quickly. Maybe you could have a race with your siblings or your mum or dad, or perhaps someone could time you.
- Minibeast Moves Wiggle like a worm, crawl like a caterpillar, jump like a
 grasshopper and fly like a butterfly to get moving. Can you think of any
 more minibeast moves?

We are learning to be creative using a variety of materials.


Suggested Activities






Learn to Draw a Ladybird










Mini Beast Bingo













Symmetry with Lego












Symmetrical butterfly wings

Playdough recipe

Play dough

You will need

8 tbsp plain flour 2 tbsp table salt 60ml warm water food colouring 1 tbsp vegetable oil



Method

- 1. Mix the flour and salt in a large bowl. In a separate bowl mix together the water, a few drops of food colouring and the oil.
- 2. Pour the coloured water into the flour mix and bring together with a spoon.
- 3. Dust a work surface with a little flour and turn out the dough. Knead together for a few minutes to form a smooth, pliable dough. If you want a more intense colour you can work in a few extra drops of food colouring.
- 4. Store in a plastic sandwich bag (squeeze out the air) in the fridge to keep it fresh.
