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LITERACY	NUMERACY & MATHS
 Reading – Bug Club/Storyworlds books covering a variety of fiction and non-fiction texts. Sounds – Jolly Phonics – learning up to 4 sounds a week with actions and songs to accompany. Writing – Using detailed pictures to tell a story. Underwriting and overwriting to increase familiarity of formation of letters and words. Listening & Talking – group and partner work, listening to stories and following instructions. 	 Numbers – recognition and formation to 10. Counting – 1:1 correspondence i.e. using objects to count one item at a time. Mental Maths strategies – dot and shape patterns, estimations, number fans, tens frames, rhythmical counting, position and order, counting on and back. 2D shapes – recognising and naming basic shapes, identifying properties and making shape pictures. Patterns – identify and create repeating patterns using shapes, colours, objects Sorting and Grouping – sort and group items using properties such as colours, shapes, material Ten Town (in class only) – online interactive site focussed on number formation and counting. Top Marks (accessible at home) - a range of interactive games that support learning in class. See homework for suggestions throughout the term.
SOCIAL STUDIES	OTHER CLASS INFORMATION
 Our Topics this term are 'All About Me' and book study following the adventures of the 'Mr Men'. Our science topic is 'My Body'. All About Me – This is a really lovely way to start the year by finding out a little bit more about us all. We will share interesting information about ourselves, our families and our friendships. Mr Men, HWB– We will read and explore some of the much loved Mr Men stories. From these stories we will explore our own Health and Wellbeing and how our community plays an important roll in keeping us safe. For example, from Mr Bump and Mr Sneeze we will focus on our health and health professionals. Mr Happy and others will help us think about feelings. Mr Greedy will help us understand how eating the right food can help us stay healthy. We will let Mr Messy and Mr Tidy help us understand how important it is to keep our learning environment clutter free and organised. And so on To complement our topic, we love to hear from you and your role in the community so if you would like to come in and speak to P1 please let your child's teacher know and we can arrange a time. My Body, Science & HWB – Looking after our bodies – toothbrushing/handwashing/cleanliness/toilet routines. Physical activity – movement and special awareness. Senses, in particular sight, i.e. Making Rainbows. Similarities and differences in our bodies. Our Body and body parts – songs, games and art activities.
