## **PRIMARY 5**

LITERACY	NUMERACY & MATHS
Reading Primary 5's novel study this term will be Danny Champion of the World. We will focus on using reciprocal reading roles, such as the predictor, questioner, summariser and clarifier to complete a range of reading and writing activities.  We will also continue to learn how to respond to different types of questioning for reading, such as literal, inferential and evaluative questions to improve higher order thinking skills.  We will continue to build on our critical literacy skills from last term, by writing critical paragraphs about characters from our novel study.  Writing Pupils will be writing imaginative stories using the DASH writing frame, for more detailed writing that will focus on description, action and dialogue. We will also be writing about Chinese landmarks, imaginative writing based on a Halloween theme and re-telling the Christmas Story.  Spelling and Grammar Primary 5 will continue to use Jolly Phonics for spelling and grammar, we will also be supporting spelling using the Complete Spelling Programme. Our spelling sounds this session include 'a', 'o', 'u', 'ar' & 'er'. In Grammar, we will be learning about abstract nours, possessive nours, comparatives and superlatives.  Listening and Talking Primary 5 will continue to develop verbal and non-verbal techniques when presenting in front of their peers. Pupils will be comparing the geographical, historical and cultural features of a country of their choice with China.	Number Processes This term Primary 5 will be focussing on understanding decimals as part of a whole number and investigating where they might use decimals in real life contexts.  2D Shape Children will describe 2D shapes using specific vocabulary including that of its angles such as acute, obtuse. We will also use technology, accurately drawing 2D shapes.  Money We will work on carrying out calculations using the four operations and using real life contexts with money.  Iime A big focus this term will be using digital and analog clocks to tell the time as well as reading timetables and understanding durations between times.  We will also be continuing to focus on our times tables, trying to increase our rapid recall and understanding of the relationship between multiplication and division.  As a whole stage, we will be focusing on using maths in real life contexts and building our mathematical reasoning by working with word problems.
SOCIAL STUDIES	OTHER CLASS INFORMATION
China Primary 5 will be learning about historic individuals and events, which have shaped Chinese society. Pupils will learn about the Geography of the country and how the landscape has affected trade, produce, industry & economy. Learners will experience learning Mandarin including, basic phrases, numbers, and create their own Chinese calligraphy. We will also look at the culture, religion and famous traditional cuisine, which can be found across the different regions. Learners will also consider Chinas role on the world economy and political affairs.	Science – Primary 5 are experimenting with mixing and separating materials, learning about reversible and irreversible substances  Art – Pupils are learning about secondary colours and experimenting with mixing colours to create an effect. They will be inspired with famous artwork including Jackson Pollock.  H.W.B. – Primary 5 are learning about the core values of friendships, wants and needs and looking at appreciating the talents and qualities of themselves and others.  R.M.E – Primary 5 are learning about different Christian stories and how they impact our society.
