3. Hurp

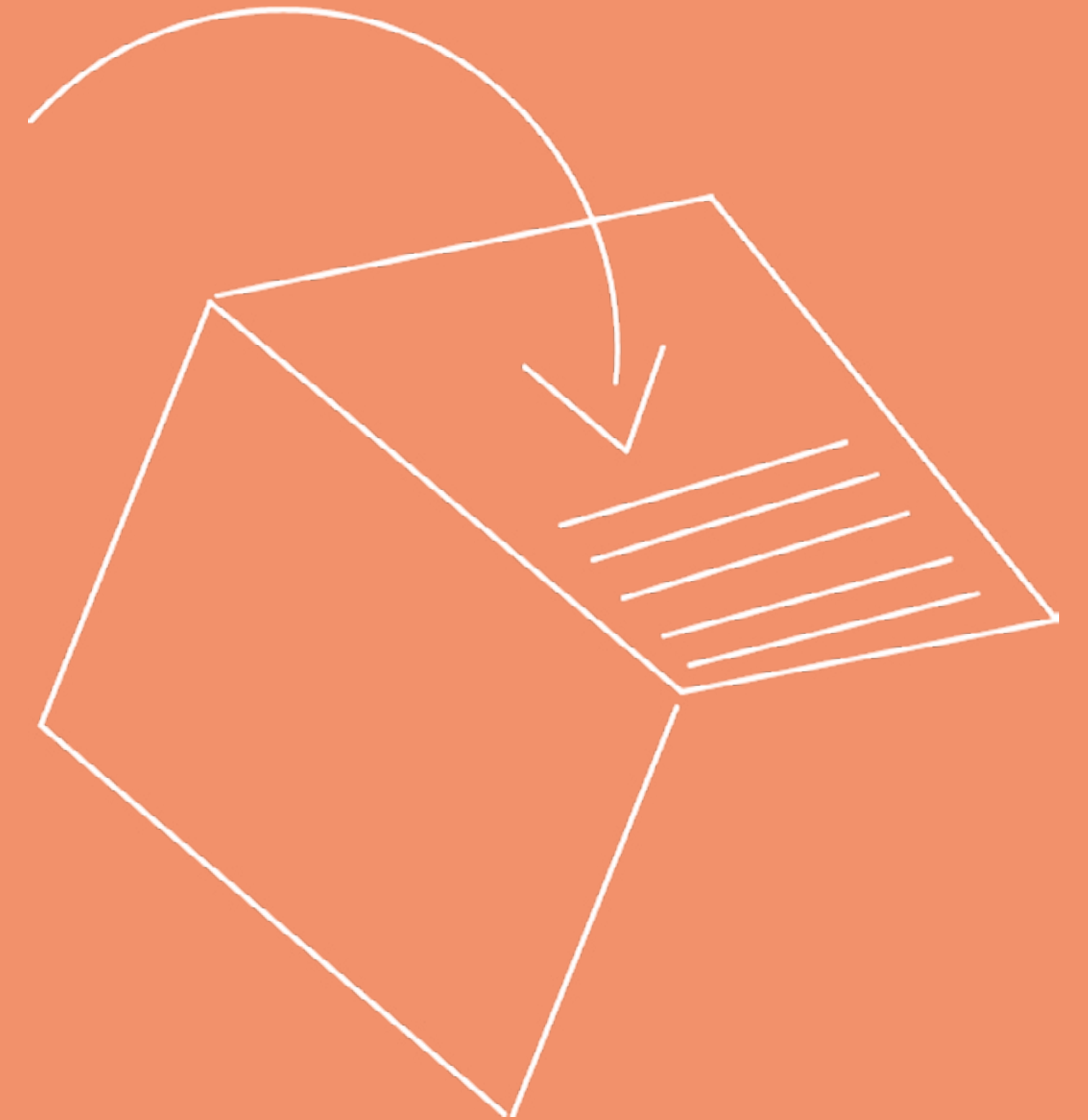
4. Snollygoster

Fold your paper in half and inside, write a really short story using as many of the words as you can.





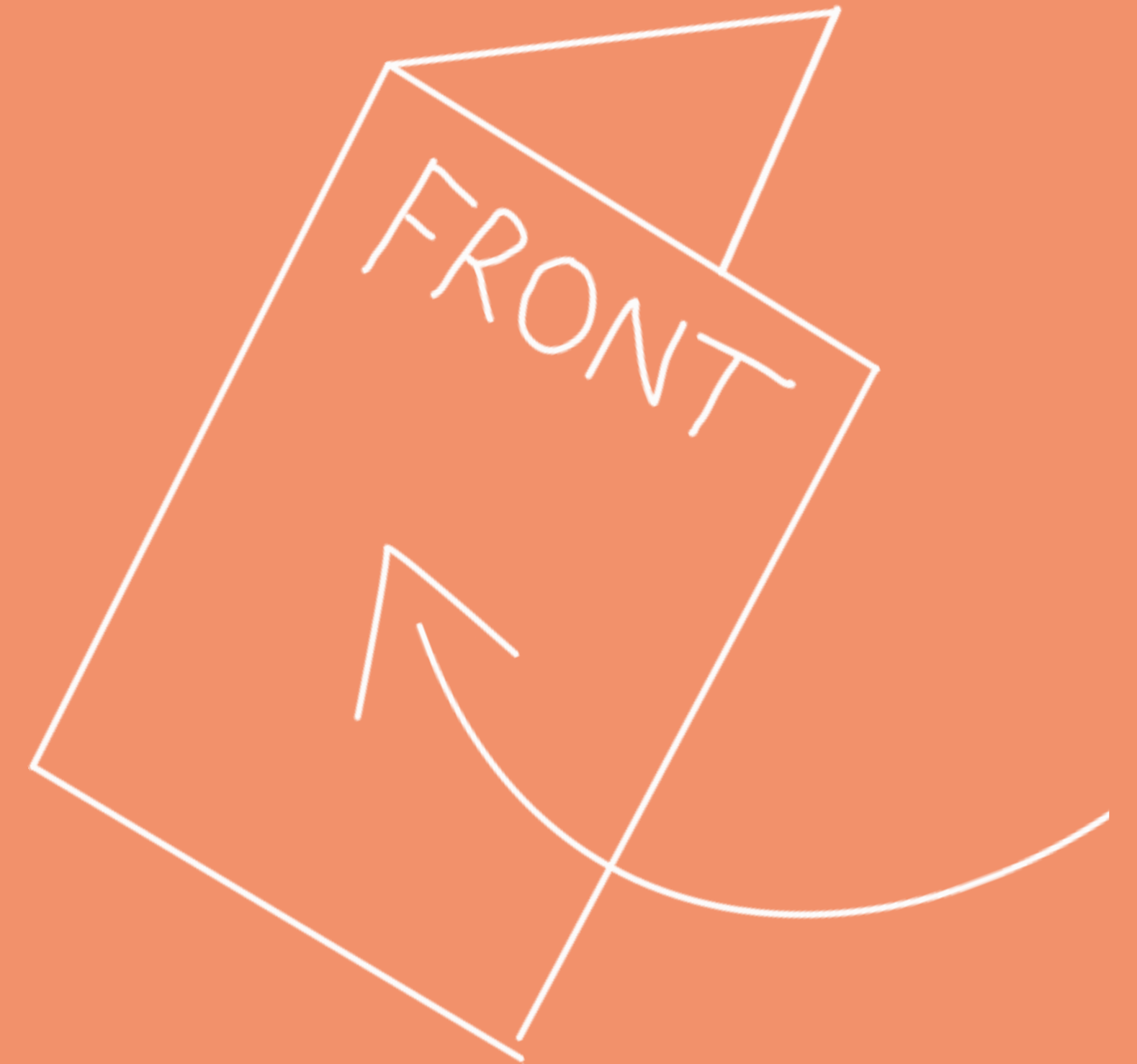
Task 3: Time to think big
