Head Teacher's Update

Dear all,

Another busy week with the children is almost at an end. We were delighted to be able to start our baking with, and for, our Star Achievers. At this time of year the school is involved in creating an Improvement Plan for the session ahead. To support our improvements we often use our weekly Citizenship Gatherings to give the children a platform to share their opinions and views on a range of different issues. At these Gatherings children in P2-P7 sit together in their Houses, (Caddon, Meigle, Fairnilee and Peel). We would like to invite you as parents to one of these gatherings this session, according to your child's House. School Lunches Parentpay

Please can you ensure that you order your child's lunch in a timely manner as we have had a significant number of children who do not have lunches ordered. This can cause issues with catering supplies and preferred meal options not being available as well as taking up valuable staff time to rectify.

Labelling Uniform

As the children settle back into school, please check that you have labelled and named all items of your child's uniform. Already we have a number of jumpers and other items without names which means reuniting them with their rightful owner is tricky. If your child has unlabelled items of clothing, these may be stored in lost property until they have been correctly identified by you. Thank you for your support with this.
