### **Head Teacher's Update**

Dear all,

We are delighted to share with all our families that our school has received a Digital Schools Scotland Award. In order to achieve this award, there were a number of criteria that we had to meet. We were able to do this by gathering and sharing evidence from across the last three years. Last week, Dr Katharine Jewitt, a Digital Schools Validator facilitated an online assessor visit and spoke with pupils and staff, and then confirmed we were to receive this award. She has sent us her report confirming our award and I have included a few highlights from her report here:



The use of digital technology is a fundamental part of the school's vision and enables pupils to have choice, flexibility, control and independence in their learning. The school's use of technology takes a considered approach. Digital learning is embedded throughout the school and at all levels, across all staff and pupils. There was strong evidence of pupil voice. Teachers facilitate and become guides on the side rather than sages on the stage. The use of digital technologies to support pupils with additional needs was strongly evident. Excellent examples were provided of how technology is used to support children with additional support needs, helping pupils to learn in a variety of ways to suit their needs, building confidence and developing skills... to support learners with dyslexia and support improvement in numeracy and literacy. There is a culture of using technology to support stealth learning. Pupils are enjoying using technology and are clearly learning more than they realise. In relation to school culture, all classrooms are mature digital learning and teaching environments, where digital technologies are deployed in ways that help learners improve their resilience, motivation and self-esteem. There is no top-down dictatorship on how technology should be utilised, but a collaborative and inclusive approach with both staff and pupils. There are effective structures in place for school to communicate with parents/carers through Showbie and with other cluster schools. Both staff and pupils emphasised and demonstrated the real potential of technology to be engaging and empowering learners to learn.

We have asked the children how they would like to celebrate this award and they have come up with some great ideas! One or two themes are emerging, and we will keep you up to date with how the children celebrate their award.

There has been a lovely buzz around the school this morning as the children prepared to set up their stalls for our charity bake sale in aid of Mary's Meals. We are looking forward to sharing with the children how much money they have raised to support this worthy cause of feeding children in education around the world. Thank you to everyone who supported the children with baking or sending money into school.

Yesterday our P2/3 class set off to Bowhill to engage in pond dipping, go on a nature walk and have fun at the outdoor play park. Next week it will be the turn of our P3/4 class to go to Bowhill and for our P5 pupils to attend the annual Borders Schools Countryside Day.

This week children have been engaging in supported formative assessments linked to their class learning in order for us to have meaningful learning conversations which help each child to understand their own next steps and celebrate the progress they have been making throughout this academic year. We are proud of their successes.

- You can pay for additional childcare at a cost of £6.05 hourly rate/Daily rate £48.40 (between 8 and 10 hours per day)
- School Lunch £2.64 per day, but you can provide your child with a healthy packed lunch instead. (ready to eat)
- Snack If your child stays for 2 hours or more, they are entitled to free snack. If your child stays for a full day, there will be a charge of 10p for a 2nd snack. Alternatively, you can provide a snack from home.
