Dear all,

We have had a lovely week of sunshine and school has been busy with visitors and trips. Firstly, thank you to everyone who was able to come along to our family Stay and Play session on Wednesday. This is an important part of the children's day as it provides time for them to settle and reconnect with their peers as well as having opportunities to develop their ongoing social and emotional skills, their curiosity and creativity through play, and to have opportunities to support their resilience with problem solving activities. Teachers also use this time to organise your child's day with their lunches and any other housekeeping tasks, and they take time to have learning conversations to support children's engagement with aspects of their learning for that day.

Our P5/6 class represented our school at the Galashiels Big Sing event on Thursday. They have been practising their songs for the last few weeks and have been sounding fabulous. Thanks to the partnership with YMI (Youth Music Initiative) and their class teacher Mrs Turner, who have supported the children to sing for our school so beautifully. Mrs Turner reported "They were perfect, I was so proud of them all, and their singing was wonderful."

Our ELC children have been making the most of the outdoors this week, taking part in a shape hunt, developing their gross motor skills through running jumping and climbing, and building friendships through their play.

Shoe Box Appeal – Can you help?

Despite the difficulties that they face everyday – through poverty, illness, disability or other disadvantages – receiving a shoebox brings such joy to children and adults in Eastern Europe, that their faces light up with huge smiles.

Thank you so much for your continued support for our Shoe Box Appeal. Last year your unwavering support enabled the charity, Blythswood, to send over 85,000 shoeboxes to eight different countries – Albania, Bulgaria, Hungary, Kosovo, Moldova, Romania, Serbia and Ukraine. From those we deliver these gifts to, thank you so very much.

Filled with small, practical items such as toiletries, stationery, and clothing, the individually-wrapped boxes have been distributed in schools, hospitals, orphanages and care homes, and to households in very low income communities. Many have gone to people affected by the war in Ukraine.

There are shoeboxes available at the school office if you don't have one at home. Please read the leaflet brought home by your child for further information on what to fill your shoebox with, and drop them off at the school office. Wider Achievements

- Getting themselves ready each morning; getting dressed, packing their own schoolbag, remembering to fill their water bottle.
- Helping to clear the table after dinner
- Tidying up their games and toys after they have finished with them, without being asked.
- Continuing to practise a task or activity and mastering it such as tying shoelaces, learning to ride a bike or a new skill such as knitting, sewing etc.



Congratulations to this week's coin winners – P5/6!


Assembly
