Dear all,

Thank you to everyone who was able to come along to our Family Stay and Learn session on Wednesday where children shared aspects of their literacy learning with you. As you can see from the photos, there are several ways children learn to write across the curriculum. Parents were able to observe their child's development of skills, knowledge of spelling patterns and how they are practising writing for a range of purposes. All these aspects of literacy support children's progress. For our youngest children, the development of fine motor skills, such as manipulating small objects and developing scissor skills helps to strengthen their hands in readiness to write.

The children took part in a Halloween Scavenger Walk around the village on Thursday and Friday, looking for clues to solve a spooky word find. Thank you to the Parent Council and parent volunteers who organised and supported this event for the children.

Cluster iPad Survey

All Galashiels primary schools are reviewing how P4-P7 pupil iPads are managed over holiday periods. Some schools, such as Clovenfords PS, acted on parental feedback (following iPads remaining in school over the summer break) and kept iPads in school during the October break, reissuing these when pupils returned. They found that iPads staying in school over this holiday resulted in less breakages and allowed staff to ensure the iPads were ready for the children's return to their learning. All schools in the cluster recognise the importance of giving children a healthy break from screen time and encouraging family, outdoor, and creative activities during holidays. We would appreciate your feedback on this approach to actively supporting pupil health and wellbeing. Your views will help us make informed decisions as a cluster about how iPads are used and managed in the future. Thank you for taking the time to complete this short survey.

Wider Achievements

To support an even wider range of achievements, and to help your child to continue to develop key skills and qualities, we would like to invite you to email our school office with examples – photos would be great! - based on your child's developing understanding and demonstration of our school aims of **Respected** and/or **Safe**.

Some examples of children showing their understanding of the meaning of respected may include:

- Good sportsmanship showing respect by demonstrating graciousness in both winning and losing.
- Playing fairly this shows respect for the culture and rules of the game and shows that children understand that fairness is crucial for making the experience enjoyable for everyone.
- Positive communication using encouraging words with others and avoiding negative comments.
- Using polite language and having good manners.
- Respecting their own and others' belongings.

Some examples of children showing their understanding of being **safe** may include:

- Following rules and procedures during out of school activities including wearing safety equipment (helmets etc) and following the rules of the game.
- Using equipment properly in games, or during other activities such as baking and cooking and learning how to check equiment is in good working order.
- Being safe in their environment such as looking both ways before crossing the road, or being aware of their own and others' space during games and play.
- Helping younger or less experienced peers to follow safety rules.
- Learning how to stay safe online by following rules and checking in with an adult about safe sites, chat groups and games that are age appropriate.

We use all that you share as part of our termly contribution and achievement assemblies where the children will be celebrated. Thank you in advance.

Harvest Assembly


