Head Teacher's Update

Dear all,

Our Gathering on Wednesday morning shared some of the ways children build their literacy skills from ELC to P7. There was a focus on how they develop skills and knowledge in recognising *phonemes* (the sounds that make up a spoken word) and *graphemes* (what those sounds look like when we write them down). It all starts with children's ability to recognise sounds. Nursery rhymes are a great way to begin this process for our youngest learners and are among the building blocks needed to support children's understanding of how their reading and writing skills develop through spoken language and song. Thank you to all the parents who joined us for this – and who helped give out Clovenfords Coins to children for participating, being respectful and including each other in their House task.

We also welcomed families into school for our P4/5 assembly this morning. They have raised £533 so far for Children in Need. Their focus on kindness and upholding the rights of children across the UK through their fundraising efforts is such a wonderful example of our values in action.

We often ask for your views as parents, and we very much value the time you give to sharing your opinions as part of our school community. We try very hard to make sure these surveys are short but useful to gauge the direction and focus of our improvements etc. Our decisions in school always take account of the feedback we receive. - 3 year olds will be eligible to start Early Learning and Childcare the school term after their 3rd birthday (August; January; April).

Borders School of Music

There has been some interest from parents about children working with the Borders School of Music. Currently they are promoting a programme called "The Rock School Project". The Borders School of Music Community works alongside other primary schools in the area providing in school sessions consisting of 30 minute lessons once a week (P1-7) where children get to learn different instruments (vocals, guitar, drums, bass guitar, electric guitar, and keyboard). They get to work together in groups to make music and experiment with learning different instruments. The sessions are run by skilled tutors and performers. 


P4/5 Class Assembly


