Christmas Jumper Day

Thank you to everyone who sent in a donation as part of Christmas Jumper Day yesterday. We raised just under £100 following money coming in across the whole day. We had decided as a school that this money would be used to buy gifts for Children 1st's charity initiative this year. (See below)

After consulting with the P7s they agreed that whilst this was a lovely amount of money, they recognised that it would only buy a few gifts. They talked about the importance of all children deserving to feel special at this time of year. Therefore, they felt that some of the money that the class stalls raised at our Christmas Fair should be added to the Christmas Jumper total. They agreed a total of £200 would be a better amount to provide more gifts for Children 1st to distribute.

The children were articulate during this discussion and recognised Article 31 - the right to play, rest and relax and that all children should have equal consideration and equity of knowing that their voice matters. This is such a lovely example of our school vision and values in action. One of our P7 children said: "It's a

really nice thing to do. Even though you can't see the joy on that child's face on Christmas Day you know they really wanted it [the present]. It's good that some of the children's rights are met, like the right to play."




Christmas Assembly




