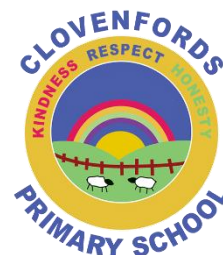

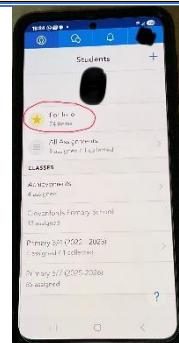

Our School

As part of the children returning to school this term we have had a reestablishment phase, which means the children have time to reflect and discuss the ways they contribute to keeping their school feeling calm, happy and purposeful to allow everyone the best opportunities to learn and flourish. This term we will further develop the children's understanding of our Aims of **Included** and **Nurtured**.

Pupil voice is important in our school. As such we asked the children to tell us more about how our values, vision and ethos matter:

We asked the children, "Why are our values important?"

They said:

"They help us to be together and safe."

"Our values are important because it teaches people what we want our school to be."

"The school values are important because they guide us in the school and learning."

"Our values encourage us to be kind and caring."

"Our values are important not only for school but for out of school as well because they teach us to value others but also yourself."

We asked the children, "What does a good learner look like in our school?"

They said:

"Someone that is honest, pays attention and doesn't speak over the teacher."

"Someone who respects others and lets others have their own opinion."

"Resilient and hard working."

"A good learner looks like a person who is trying, listening and helping."

"A good learner looks like when they have got their head down focusing on their work even when things are tricky."

We asked the children, "Why is it important that your voice is listened to?"

They said:

"We have good ideas in school and it's not just our teachers that do and we have a right to be listened to."

"So everyone gets a say in their life."

"Because if it wasn't we wouldn't have the tyres or the footballs."

"Because it's important that everyone's voice is listened to and everyone's ideas are shared."

"So you know that you matter and you are listened to."

We asked the children, "What do you do to include others?"

"It's easy to include your friends but sometimes you have to think about other people that are not your friends so maybe say hello to them and talk to them sometimes."

"If they are in the playground we can go make sure they're okay and we can ask if they want to play."

"Say yes if they ask to join in."

"When I see people left out I go see if they want to play with me because sometimes, I am left out and I like someone who wants to play with me."

We asked the children, "What is special about our school?"

They said:

"We have love in cLOVEn and we all respect each other."

"The safety and teachers giving us time."

"Lots of stuff to play with and lots of staff to talk to."

"It is calm, quiet sometimes and kind and special."

"The school values and rights respecting school."

"Because everyone is amazing in their own way and that is how this school is so special."

"The thing about this school is that everyone gets to talk about their own ideas and opinions."

"Our school is special because everyone cares about each other and it feels like there's always someone to talk to whether that is a teacher or a friend."

"That there's hot chocolate."

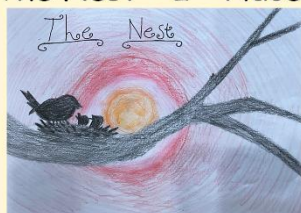
Congratulations to **Daisy** who won, and to **Ellis M** and **Millar** who were second and third respectively.

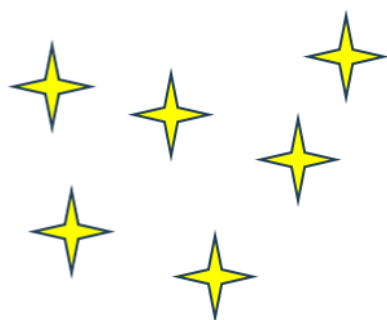


Assembly

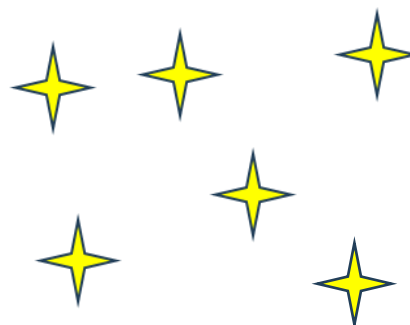
Our first assembly of 2026 included the sharing of pupil voice as part of our reestablishment phase as well as announcing the Nest Competition winners - see above for more details on both.
