



Curriculum Structure at HHS

Broad General Education					
S1-2	Students take a wide range of subjects				
S3	Breadth and Depth / Personalisation and Choice: Students narrow down their subjects to 6 (plus compulsory and core) But must still take a broad range across all curricular areas				

Senior Phase	or Phase					
S4 (SCQF L3-5)	Students will specialise in <mark>5</mark> subjects (plus English and Maths) for qualifications (National 4, National 5, Skills for Work, NPAs and NCs) from the 8 in S3					
S5-6 (SCQF L4-7)	Students will continue with 6 qualifications (National 4/5/Higher). In S6 students will be given the option to slim down to 5 qualifications (including work experience and Leadership Awards etc)					

Broad General Education - S3

- ▶ S3 students will narrow down their subjects to eight, but must still take a broad range across all curricular areas.
- English and Mathematics and Modern Languages are compulsory, as are core entitlements of Physical Education, Faith and Philosophy and Personal and Social Education (PSD)
- In addition to this provision, learners select 6 other subjects.

 - Sciences






Next Steps in Supporting your child


There are some practical ways to support your child right now:


- Help them access their 'myworldofwork' account so you can see what it has to offer.
- A careers appointment email and request an appointment.
- You can tell the school if you can offer a work experience placement to other young people or give a talk to specific subject areas relating to your own work.
 The school is keen to hear from parents how school subjects relate to real life work.
- Talk to your child about their next steps and their subjects.....
- Always reassure them that there are other ways or options for learning new skills and retraining if they decide to do something different in the future.
- Help them get the support they need to make decisions.

Complete paper form and sign it to bring back to school on Interview Day.



Selection of subjects via interview with Guiadance Teacher on Monday 27th or Tuesday 28th January. Interview Times posted in \$2 TEAMS
