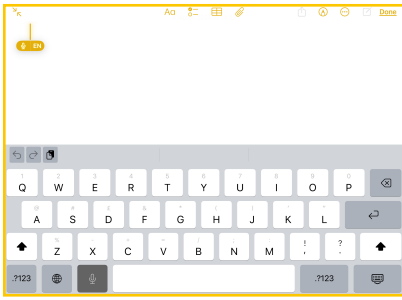
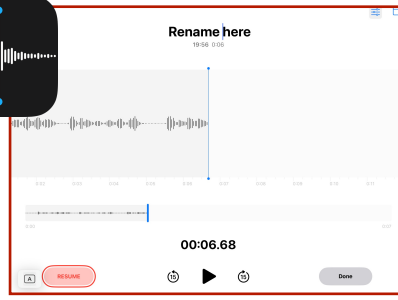




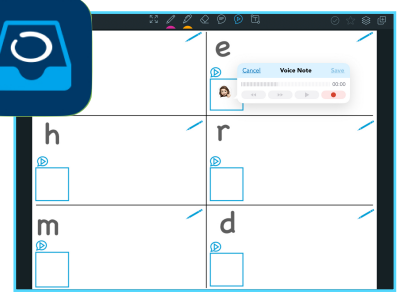
iPad for Oracy - 10 Top Tips



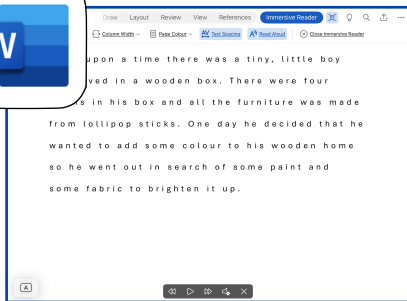
1. Use microphone on ANY app where a Keyboard pops up to **dictate** speech to text. [Click here for more info on using Dictate on iPad](#)

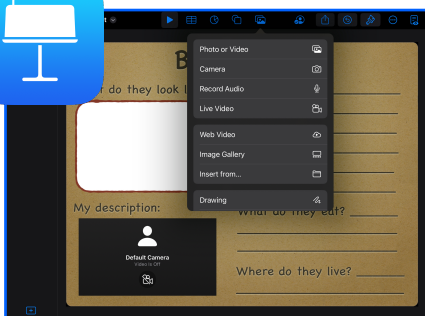

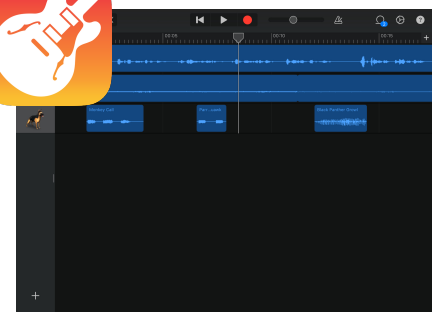
