




# P4 Home Learning

## Literacy

### Task 1 - Adjective Match

Watch this clip to remind you what adjectives are and how we use them.





Create a deck of cards with different adjectives written on each card. You'll also need some images (pictures from magazines, travel brochures etc) that can be described by adjectives.

Now here's how the game works:

- Each player chooses an image.
- Deal four cards to each player.
- If the player can describe the image with all four cards they win. If not, then discard a card and choose a new card from the pile.
- Play continues until a winner is found.

## Task Two: Spelling Long O



Draw a table with 4 columns like the grid in the picture.

Think of as many words as you can that have long o sound for each pattern and add them to your table. How many can you think of? Make sure you spell them correctly and they are real words. Email your grids to us.

## Task Three: Noun Showdown



Write a noun on a board/piece of paper or show it as an image e.g. a tree. Each person has a minute to write down as many adjectives as they can. Get a point for every adjective that is appropriate and see who gets the most points.

#### **African Elephants**

African elephants are the largest land animals in the world.

Elephants eat grass, fruit, leaves, branches and roots. They use their trunks to gather grass and pick leaves and fruit.

Elephants suck up water with their long trunks, and put the water in their mouths. Their longest teeth are called tusks. Elephants use their tusks to push down trees, and dig up the roots.

Elephants live in families called herds. The oldest female elephant leads the herd.

She knows where the best grass grows, and she remembers where to find water.

Elephants remember many things.

African elephants are very intelligent. They are amazing animals

## Numeracy

### Task 1 - Cheating division – The rule for dividing by 3 and 9



A number can be divided by 3 if all the digits add up to make a number in the 3 times table

Try and find some 4 digit numbers that divide by 3 e.g.  $3492 = 3+4+9+2$  makes 18 which is in the 3 times table so 3493 can be divided by 3 (check with a calculator).

A number can be divided by 9 if all the digits add up to make a number in the 9 times table

Try and find some 4 digit numbers that divide by 9 e.g.  $9855 = 9+8+5+5$  makes 27 which is in the 9 times table so 9855 can be divided by 9.

### Task 2 - Telling the time revision

Make your own analogue clock using a paper plate, a circle of card (draw around a plate on a cereal box) or another creative idea like the pictures below. Make sure the numbers are evenly spaced and you have a long hand and a short hand.



# Hula Hoop Clock


*Take math outside!*




Set your clock to a variety of times eg 3 o' clock, half past 10, quarter past 6 or quarter to 2. Remember the big hand points to the hour and the small hand points to the minutes.

Watch these clips to remind you about telling the time.

You could print and cut out this clock if you are unsure how to make your own.

### Task 3 - Times Tables War

Keep practising your times tables, especially the ones you aren't so confident with. Play times table wars – you will need a pack of playing cards.

Shuffle the cards and each player takes 2 cards. Multiply the 2 numbers together (face cards are worth 10 and aces can be either 1 or 11) and whoever gets the highest number wins a point.

### Task 4 - Time - am and pm



Watch the video about am and pm. Now, make a list of all the things you have done today in order with the correct time next to it. Remember to put am or pm to show if it happened in the morning or afternoon.

Eg

8am Got up  
8.15am Had my breakfast  
8.30am Got dressed  
8.45am Brushed my teeth  
9am Drew a picture etc



### Task 2 - Email a friend
