Newsletter - 04/11/22

Dear Parent/Carer

You may be aware that senior Education staff from Scottish Borders Council conducted an Inspection style review of our school during the first week back after the October break. This was a robust and challenging process that identified some important and key strengths in our school as well as areas where we must improve as a school.

Key strengths:

- Raising attainment and achievement was deemed to be a key strength especially in relation to attainment over time, attainment in Literacy and Numeracy, overall quality of attainment and our 98.4% positive destination rate. In all of these areas we are performing better than our Virtual Comparator School.
- Positive interactions between staff and young people in all settings.
- Our Peebles High School Learning Framework is leading to improvement to the quality of Learning and Teaching across all departments and faculties.

Areas for improvement and action:

- Communication was identified as a key area for improvement. This Newsletter represents the start of our commitment to keeping you better informed of the life of our school, important news, notable successes, progress with our School Improvement Plan and introductions to new members of staff. Initially our Newsletters will be weekly or fortnightly and then we will ask you in the new year about how useful you find them and the frequency with which you would wish to receive them.
- Young people feeling unsafe at school was also highlighted as a concern and something we are taking immediate steps to address. While the review team observed a very orderly and safe school environment during the week they were in our school, a significant minority of young people still report feeling unsafe due to issues such as the poor repair of toilets, the rumours of weapons in the press and social media or the behaviour of a small group of other young people at social times. We are undertaking an immediate review of our approaches to tackling poor behaviour and our Positive Relationships Policy.
- Support for our young people with Additional Support Needs is also being reviewed and improvements/changes to our provision and approaches to support these young people will be communicated soon.
- Leadership. Leadership is to improve in order to take forward the areas in need of
 improvement as described above. A crucial part of this process is the appointment of two new
 DHTs over the course of the next week. Thanks in advance to the members of the Parent
 Council who will be joining me on the panel to conclude those interviews on Monday and
 Wednesday of next week.

New Members of Staff

We welcome aboard Miss Mel Haldane, PT Enhanced Provision, and Mrs Kathryn Ramage, PT Support for Learning. Clearly, their roles in leading improvements for the young people in their care is crucial to delivering the improvements expected by SBC outlined above. Both have already made a positive start to their careers in our school.


