We are committed to improving the school experience of our young people so that they feel safe in school. During our September assembly, young people learned about the difference between banter and bullying and how saying something is banter doesn't mean it is.







52 and 53 young people enjoyed sessions with a company called Humanutopia. Steve and Ryan spoke about how we can have our 'emotional bin' filled by the behaviour of others and how our behaviour can fill the bins of others. With the help of our 55/6 'Heroes', they encouraged young people and staff volunteers to get out of their comfort zone to be the best version of themselves.



Germany visit

Early morning on Saturday the 9th of September 36 pupils, 4 teachers and our wonderful bus driver Brian departed Peebles High school and started our journey to Germany.

Upon arrival on Sunday, we were welcomed by the music staff and our exchange partners at Ursulinengymnasium in Werl. Everyone whom we had the pleasure of meeting throughout the exchange was very welcoming, and I do not hesitate when I say everyone went that extra mile to make sure our trip was the very best it could be. We are all very grateful to our exchange families. They have all nurtured us and been very supportive throughout the week. We can't possibly thank them enough. During the school day (which begins at 7.45 am!) we rehearsed the music for the concert. It stands on ancient castle ruins and is a mixture of old and new buildings. On the Wednesday night, we had an out-door ceilidh where we taught our German partners to dance. The parents brought a lovely buffet. On Thursday the 14th of September we had our concert which almost 200 people attended. I think we can safely say our favourite piece was 'Loch Lomond (Runrig Version)' and this was our finale.

We performed 16 pieces. We had an orchestra and choir (which the German students participated in), and a guitar group. After this we had another ceilidh which was danced brilliantly by both German and Scottish students as well as parents and teachers.

We cannot thank the German and Scottish music staff for making this trip happen. We would also like to immensely thank our bus driver for safely escorting us all there and back (via Europe's largest music store). We all look forward to June 2024 when the German students come to Peebles High School.



55/6 Attitude Matters Workshops



Showbie Learning Portfolios



One important part of our work on improving our learners' understanding of their progress is the introduction of Showbie Learning Portfolios, an online space where feedback and pupil reflections on learning can be stored. This portfolio can be viewed on an Apple device or on a web browser. Unlike other apps used on our Inspire Learning iPads, the content uploaded to Showbie can be viewed by parents as well as by pupils and teachers (only pupils and teachers can contribute to the platform). Showbie will be used school-wide this session for the following purposes:

Pupils' tracking and monitoring reports will be uploaded to their Showbie House Class in line with the academic year reporting calendar.

Throughout the year, feedback and/or pupil reflections on their key assessments will be uploaded by pupils to their individual subjects' Showbie classes and added to their overarching 'portfolio'. This will be an ongoing process reflecting individual subject assessment schedules. Parent access to the 'portfolio', a place where assessments and other information from across all subjects is collated into a single and easy to view format, should supplement our tracking and monitoring reports by giving more regular updates on each child's progress.

We hope that our use of Showbie will support parents to encourage their child's ongoing reflection on their learning and actioning of next steps.

S1 parents were provided with their Showbie codes last week to coincide with the publication of the first tracking report. We plan to disseminate Showbie parent codes for all other learners by the end of next week.
