

What are the saltire awards?

The Saltire Awards are the Scottish Government's way of celebrating, recognising and rewarding the commitment, contribution and achievements of young volunteers in Scotland, aged between 12 and 25. All young people between these ages can sign up online – and everything is completed through your online account. You will receive your certificate by PDF format, and you can request Volunteer Centre Borders to print the certificate for you.

Young people gain nationally recognised certificates, signed by Scottish Government Ministers, for the different amounts of volunteering hours they do. The hours awards start from 10 and end at 500 hours so plenty awards to get along the way.

What is volunteering?

The Saltire Awards recognise volunteering that meets the following three clear characteristics:

- It is a free will activity. This means you are doing it because you want to, and no one is forcing you to do it.
- It is not done for financial gain. Volunteering is not a job and you cannot be paid; however, you may have any reasonable expenses covered.

It is for the benefit of the community, society at large or an individual

Why you might want to volunteer?

- Gain new skills and experience that will look great on your CV and could help you at school and/or work
- Meet new people and make new friends and connections
- Make a difference to individual people, communities and the environment Have fun! You will have the chance to get involved in variety of activities that might not have done before

MVP (Mentors in Violence) Prevention)

Mentors in Violence Prevention is a peer mentoring programme that gives young people the chance to explore and challenge the attitudes, beliefs and norms that can lead to all forms of gender-based violence. The programme is open to S5 and S6 students.

What impact can it have?

- You will help to make a difference in our school community by tackling issues such as physical violence, name-calling, unsolicited sexting, coercive + controlling behaviours and harassment.
- By mentoring S2 classes, you will help to build positive relationships across the school and be a safe + friendly face for young people to go to for help.
- Being a mentor will help to improve your leadership skills and will boost your confidence. It looks great on a CV/application!

What is involved?

- All mentors will undergo 2 days of training in June. If you did this in S5, you only need to come for 1 day.
- You will deliver 6 lessons to \$2 classes throughout the year. You will be in a group with other mentors and the lessons will be provided for you to use.
- You will meet with Mrs Ferguson at various points throughout the year at a lunchtime (not weekly). This means that your weekly Leadership period can be used to complete the Leadership booklet and to do other revision.
- As it is at a lunchtime, you can also join this group in addition to your chosen Leadership activity.

There are over 12 Sports Clubs, and 25 different organised Sports Sessions each week at Peebles High School. These are all run by volunteer teachers, parents and coaches.

ALL of the clubs on offer at PHS for younger age groups would benefit from more help at sessions including setting up practices and encouraging pupils. Senior pupils willing to plan sessions, lead warm ups and umpire games will enhance the experiences for young people. Last year we had several committed and confident S6 volunteers who built strong relationships with pupils, and were role models within school.

What do Mental Health Ambassadors do?

S5 and S6 students can sign up to become Mental Health Ambassadors. This group aims to work together to tackle mental health stigma and discrimination in our school community. You will



receive training from See Me in August and meet regularly to organise events and campaigns within the school.

Why is it important?

Young people across Scotland were surveyed to find out more about their mental health, and the stigma they face.



39% of young people think that teachers take them seriously when they try to talk about mental health



51% of young people wouldn't tell anyone if they were finding it difficult to cope with their mental health

We all want this to improve.

By working together, we can create school environments where young people feel safe, supported and able to talk about how they're feeling – free from stigma and discrimination.

With See Me See Change, we can do this.

Leading youth charity, the D of E, gives all young people aged 14-24 the chance to develop skills for life and work, fulfil their potential and have a brighter future. You can do the Duke of Edinburgh award at three levels, which when completed, lead to a Bronze, Silver or Gold Award.

You achieve your Award by completing a personal programme of activities in four sections (five if you are going for Gold) - Volunteering, Physical, Skills, Expedition and for Gold, a residential. You will find yourself helping people or the community, getting fitter, developing skills, going on an expedition and taking part in a residential activity (Gold only).
