

PHS Parent Council AGM 12 June 2024 Peebles High School

Minutes of Previous AGM

The Minutes were approved.

Chair's Report

5 meetings this academic year plus tonight's AGM, all held face to face in the school

Key successes:

- Transport to Borders College (immediate solution as response to short notice withdrawal and informed change to future timetable resilience in future)
- Advocacy role in the provision of dedicated study space and ultimately very welcome reinstatement of LRC for that purpose
- Provided parent contributions to Communication Strategy, Behaviour Policy, and now Reporting
- Continued provision of support to young people applying to university
- Value of PC role, commitment and knowledge recognised by at SBC Education Sub-Committee meeting
- Supported recruitment of new Depute (mat leave cover)
- Supported delivery of the Careers Fair
- Supported HMIE Inspection process
- Supported projects across the school with funding from charity

Challenges:

- HMIE Inspection, followed by change in HT at relatively short notice (communications from SBC weren't always timely or as clear as they might have been)
- Test of split prelims wasn't limited to a small number of subjects as had been previously indicated study leave arrangements caused confusion
- Ongoing accommodation limitations
- Timing and duplication of requests for information (surveys)—inspection, SBC, PC led to reduction in response rate to PC survey
- Complete vacuum of support / engagement from SBC only one digital meeting has taken place this year, all others cancelled at short notice, and face to face event scheduled for tomorrow has just been cancelled too

Additional Information:

- Provisional dates for next academic year to be checked against school calendar (will rotate across Tue/Wed/Thu)
- Preference is still to meet face to face will explore digital possibilities
- Plan to use first meeting of next year as informal welcome session to encourage parents of new S1s to attend
- Focus of next year's support –improvement priorities identified during inspection
- Coordinate with Pupil Parliament and Senior Students to gather their feedback about where we should focus efforts

Attendance is generally better at PC meetings when they are virtual. Is there another way we could meet digitally? Free version of Teams cuts out after 1 hour. Also better attended when meeting was in the new gym and the student council attended, and new build plans were on view. Ask other students and groups to join to tell us what's important to them?

Action: Dawn to investigate another digital platform. If anyone has suggestions please shout.

Headteacher's Report

• Staffing Vacancies currently in English, Chemistry, Business/Computing

New School

- Engagement with practical subjects is ongoing
- New plans complete, further consultation will be with staff

The meeting had a long discussion about the new school building, prompted by the PC asking if there will be further engagement sessions.

The Head advised that the project team has been engaging with the school – they've been reaching out to practical (grnd floor) subjects, art/music/drama/technical. All staff questions are put to the project team. There will be consultation with staff when needed (eg for practical subjects, sound/light, technical aspects). The project team is consulting the Head when they need answers from teachers. The rest will be an info basis. There is not a mechanism to shape this further by parents. The project is on time, the plans are on the website, they've not changed. SBC are saying there is nothing more to say at the moment. BAM send out their newsletters and the Head has asked for more info sessions.

Q&A

PC commented that it would be good to tell parents that, that they are engaging with school. There could be a session to show new parents the plans, selling it, a positive thing.

Any comms about the school have to be by someone else. There is nothing new currently. The Friday update could state that the practical subjects are engaging.

Community has an appetite to understand what it will look like etc. not to change it. We could add value as a PC and work together to make it a positive experience. Building is a facilitator of a new way of learning etc.

Our focus just now is 100% about the Inspection revisit. I don't see us making a huge change to the way we teach. Priority next year is to make the BGE experience much better. We have 10 sessions next year about Learning & Teaching.

This is a different message that Lesley Munro gave us last year, about changes in teaching. Parents can have a role in communicating that to each other and the children. Already there's an expectation, uncertainties about the new school, we don't want that to build.

Assembly today was focused entirely on 'learning & teaching'. All of us came to teaching to provide the best Learning & Teaching. Self-evaluation is happening with teachers. I have to focus on improving Learning & Teaching for the inspection. Trust us to do this. We are looking at a much broader curriculum...but you can't do that overnight.

You re in post until end of January 2025 after the inspectors visit again. The community would like some certainty about leadership after January 25 until Oct 25 when the new school is finished?

It has been raised there is a concern about that period...and there needs to be continuity. I could ask the question. There will be a recruitment process after the further inspection.

PC raised the concern that SBC do not engage well with Parent Council - can we get together with other Parent Councils to assert our power, as we did with budget? The Chair confirmed that the PC chairs in the Borders have got together and discussed this.

The meeting discussed the possibility of the first PC session in August not just focusing on S1 parents but also an opportunity to view the plans and ask questions about the new building. Students could be involved too – what are they excited about? The Head agreed it would be good to have some kind of engagement with staff and parents to cover this as a positive story, with the plan for the next 18 months. Everyone is excited and enthusiastic about the new school. PC suggested teachers could come along to PC meetings – one to each - to talk about their subject and how they've engaged on the new build and what they're excited about. PC asked the Head to please consider how parents can help out with this.

Has the change to Borders College moving to a Friday impacted the numbers attending?

I have not heard anything.

Pupil Survey

The Head briefly shared some of the Pupil survey results. The survey shows that from Oct 23 – Mar 24 things have improved across all areas. 900 pupils completed the survey.

PC commented that the meeting really appreciated seeing these results and a 10% improvement in 6 months is significant. It would be good to have a session on this with PC, and pupils, rather than just drop it on the website.

There are 179 S6 just now. The meeting discussed the number of subjects in S6. Including Leadership positions and School Service.

After the summer Mr Reid will be looking at S1 choice point and 6 subjects in S4. Hopefully current P7 will experience a difference, but it is a huge change and affects the 'free choice' process (rather than columns). The meeting discussed the S1 choice point as it is still generally not popular with parents.

Modern Languages has suffered as a result of the S1 choice point – are there any plans for that?

Yes absolutely, it is more promising. The uptake is strong. German is back. There are 4 subjects running. We need more staff in languages.

The meeting again discussed PC meetings throughout the year – perhaps the October one could focus on survey results and exam results.

Friends of PHS Report – (Acting) Chair Tristan Compton

See report at end of minutes. Key points: FoPHS needs a new Trustee to join by the AGM on 10 September. There is a legal requirement for a charity to have 5-7 and we will have 4. Plea to please get in touch if you would like to be a trustee.

Any bid over £1000 has to be approved by PC as well as the charity. Tristan sought approval for the items detailed and approval was granted by the Parent Council.




