House Captains

The House Captain role is a very important role within the school. It provides a level of responsibility for S5 and S6 pupils wishing to develop a range of leadership skills. House Captains will have responsibility for promoting all things to do with House identity including, publicising, organising and leading events. This role will require commitment as House captains are expected to be available on average two lunchtimes per week.

Promoting House Identity

House Captains will be expected to promote House identity through the uniform they wear. They will wear House ties and be present at all Inter-house assemblies and events including Sports Day. House Captains will ensure that all pupils within their Houses are fully informed of all upcoming events, along with promoting a healthy competitive spirit between the Houses. It is expected that House Captains will be present at all Student Council meetings.

Organising and Leading Events

All House Captains and Vice Captains will play an active role in preparing for and delivering Interhouse activities throughout the year. The House Team will determine a calendar of events and will have responsibility for organising publicising and running these events. They will take control of the administration of points systems, scoring and recording and will work alongside a member of staff to ensure that all activities are inclusive and conducted in a safe manner.

Pupils applying for this role will require the following skills:

- Confidence
- Organisational skills
- Communication skills
- Leadership ability
- Enthusiasm
- Team spirit
- Commitment

House Captains and Vice Captains will be interviewed and selected from S5 and S6. They will meet on a weekly basis to plan, review and host events.

Leading youth charity, the D of E, gives all young people aged 14-24 the chance to develop skills for life and work, fulfil their potential and have a brighter future. You can do the Duke of Edinburgh award at three levels, which when completed, lead to a Bronze, Silver or Gold Award.

You achieve your Award by completing a personal programme of activities in four sections (five if you are going for Gold) - Volunteering, Physical, Skills, Expedition and for Gold, a residential. You will find yourself helping people or the community, getting fitter, developing skills, going on an expedition and taking part in a residential activity (Gold only).


Nurture Ambassadors

What are the saltire awards?

The Saltire Awards are the Scottish Government's way of celebrating, recognising and rewarding the commitment, contribution and achievements of young volunteers in Scotland, aged between 12 and 25. All young people between these ages can sign up online – and everything is completed through your online account. You will receive your certificate by PDF format, and you can request Volunteer Centre Borders to print the certificate for you.

Young people gain nationally recognised certificates, signed by Scottish Government Ministers, for the different amounts of volunteering hours they do. The hours awards start from 10 and end at 500 hours so plenty awards to get along the way.

What is volunteering?

The Saltire Awards recognise volunteering that meets the following three clear characteristics:

- It is a free will activity. This means you are doing it because you want to—and no one is forcing you to do it.
- It is not done for financial gain. Volunteering is not a job and you cannot be paid; however, you may have any reasonable expenses covered.
- It is for the benefit of the community, society at large or an individual

Why you might want to volunteer?

- Gain new skills and experience that will look great on your CV and could help you at school and/or work
- Meet new people and make new friends and connections
- Make a difference to individual people, communities and the environment Have fun! You will have the chance to get involved in variety of activities that might not have done before

Buddy Up – Peeblesshire Youth Trust

The 'Buddy Up' role is very important within Peebles High School.

S6 Buddies will work alongside Peeblesshire Youth Trust (PYT) to help support S1 pupils who

may feel a little nervous at the start of high school, may be struggling to make friends or

who might need a little support in joining clubs or finding their way around the school.

If you are in S6 and think that you would make a good buddy to an S1 pupil for their first

term then please apply for this role! You must be willing to give up some of your free time at

break or lunchtimes to support your S1 student, acting as a positive role model. Your role

will be to offer 1-1 support, identify groups and activities which the pupil might like to get

involved in and help improve their social skills and self-confidence.

Seniors will develop various skills through working as a buddy, however, there are basic skills

needed to carry out this role successfully, such as:

Good listening skills

Empathy

Patience

A non-judgemental approach

Good organisational skills

Once you have signed up to become a buddy, compulsory training and support will be pro-

vided by PYT.

This role will provide useful experience for students hoping to pursue a career working with

people.

WHAT IS YSLP?

A programme that gives Young People in Scotland the chance to **inspire**, **create**, **discover** and **lead** through the creation and delivery of STEM activities, events and interactions within their schools, communities and youth groups.

The Young STEM Leader Programme (YSLP) aims to inspire more young people to develop an interest in STEM and pursue the study of STEM subjects and relevant future pathways. At PHS we are running the programme for the SCQF **Level 6** award (equivalent to Higher) and this carries **4 credit points rated by SQA** (minimum 30 hours work).

WHAT WILL I GET OUT OF YSL?

It will allow you to develop important leadership, communication, and employability skills:

Planning, Organising, Teamwork, Time Management, Confidence, Presenting, Innovation.

You will learn about Careers in STEM. You will also develop an understanding of the stereotypes that exist in STEM and how to challenge them.

WHAT WILL I HAVE TO DO TO ACHIEVE THE YSL AWARD?

Participate in initial training sessions (5 x 1-hour sessions).

Create, plan and deliver a minimum of 3 related STEM activities (total 4 hours) that show progression.

Complete a logbook detailing what you have learned and evidencing your development.

WHAT ACTIVITIES CAN I LEAD?

The YSLP Award is very flexible. There is a huge variety of activities that can fit the requirements of the Award. If you lead sessions that inspire others to engage in STEM activities, then it will help you become a YSL. You will be given advice on how to select and plan your sessions.

MVP (Mentors in Violence) Prevention)

Peebles High School was the first school in the Scottish Borders to be involved in the Mentors in Violence Prevention (MVP) programme and this has run successfully in the school for many years. The programme is open to S6 students and those selected will be trained as peer mentors.

MVP is an approach to gender violence and bullying prevention which was first developed in the USA. It is designed to train S6 students to use their status to speak out against all forms of violent and abusive behaviour. The MVP programme utilises a 'creative bystander' approach in which young people are seen as empowered bystanders, able to support their friends and classmates as well as having safe strategies to challenge the attitudes of their friends.

MVP seeks to give young people a voice to discuss issues, identify positive and challenge negative attitudes, and seeks to engage males and females as allies in reducing violence. Feedback from previous mentors is very positive; they recognised that their input could make a difference by empowering young people to speak out against behaviours which they find unacceptable. They were also able to identify skills which they developed themselves — teamwork, confidence, public speaking, organisation etc. which will prepare them well for the future.

All S5/6 pupils will complete an introduction to MVP on the 12/13 of June, and then have the opportunity to sign up and complete the full training to become a peer mentor.



Dementia Friendly Tweeddale
