
HOW YOU CAN HELP WITH WRITING STORIES

Imaginative Writing

When writing stories children learn to:

use a good

title

write a clear introduction and sequence events to develop the story.

set the story in the past **or** present.

describe characters and setting and create atmosphere.

link characters with events. write an ending that ties up all loose ends.

Tools for Writing

- Use full stops, commas and question marks accurately and experiment with other punctuation for effect e.g. exclamation marks, inverted commas, dashes, brackets, etc.
- * Accurate spelling of all common and familiar words.
- * Use a range of joining words e.g. although, however, since, in order to. etc.
- Deliberately use adjectives and/or adverbs for detail and description.
- * Vary sentence beginnings and lengths.
- * Mark paragraphs correctly.
- * Handwriting is accurate and consistent.
