

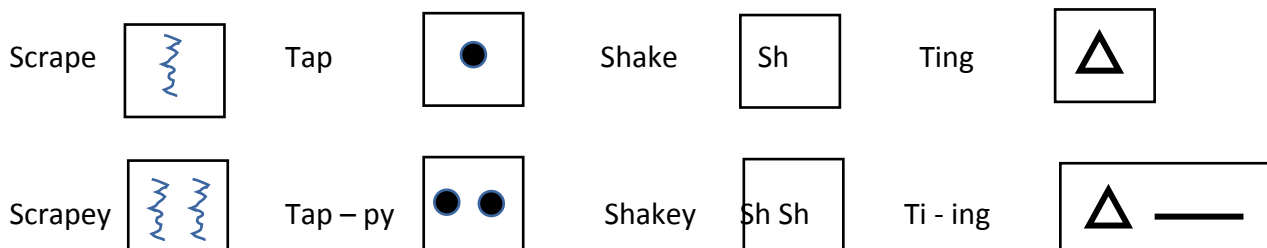
Scrape, Tap, Shake and Ting – Project Guide

Stage 1 – Making Instruments:

The first 4 videos will give you some ideas on how to make instruments at home. Feel free to experiment with other materials you have at home to make scrape, tap, shake and scrape sounds.

Simple rhythm cards are used to introduce graphic notation. You could make your own at home and come up with new combinations.

The symbols are:



Stage 2 – practise playing and reading:

Scrape, Tap, Shake and Ting part 1 – this video allows you to practise reading all the cards for each instrument one after another. Encourage your child to make their own card with more variations and play them together.










Scrape, Tap, Shake and Ting part 2 – this video shows how to set up ready to mix up cards using all four sounds if you only have two players. Share out the instruments so that between you all the sounds can be played without stopping.

Scrape, Tap, Shake and Ting part 3 – this video goes through a series of cards challenging you to work as a pair or in a bigger group with all 4 sounds. Once you can play these cards confidently then use the different ones you have made at home.

Scrape, Tap, Shake and Ting part 4 – this video is much more challenging. Each card uses a mixture of two or more sounds. Again, once you have practised these examples you can create and compose your own rhythms.

Try creating a grid with four lines of rhythm to play together and perform:
