2. Summary of the written comments on what is working well and the school's strengths (45 responses from parents and carers)

- The Social and Emotional Base, Pupil Support and Support for Learning.
- Professional, supportive and dedicated staff.
- The quality of learning and teaching.
- The school's commitment to inclusion and nurture.
- The peer support provided by older pupils to younger pupils.
- The school building and the school's resources.
- Transition and induction arrangements for new pupils.
- The breadth of the curriculum on offer in the school.
- Lunchtime clubs and activities.
- After school study clubs.
- Parents' Evenings.
- The school library.
- The school's menu and food choices.
- Helpful communication with school news.
- Support for this survey to gather views.

3. Summary of the written comments on what is not working well, the challenges and weaknesses in the school (59 responses from parents and carers)

- (a) Concerns from some parents and carers about pupil safety in the school.
- (b) Concerns about the use of mobile phone use in the school.
- (c) School toilets and the lack of privacy.
- (d) Concerns about inadequate social spaces/social areas.
- (e) Inconsistent learning and teaching.

- (f) Strategies to support individual children are not always progressed.
- (g) Unnecessary communication advertising the role of external services and events.
- (h) Concerns about staffing gaps, vacancies and lack of subject specialists, in some areas of the school.

4. Ideas for improving the school (53 responses from parents and carers)

- (a) Develop approaches to dealing with bullying and anti-social behaviour.
- (b) Review the use of mobile phones.
- (c) More effective use of digital technology to support learning and teaching.
- (d) More opportunities for pupil voice.
- (e) Review the school's vision and purpose.
- (f) Develop the school's curriculum.
- (g) More support for individual pupils and more consistency when responding to parental concerns and queries.
- (h) More opportunities for pupils to meet with their Pupil Support teacher.
- (i) Develop transition programmes, especially for new secondary five pupils.
- (j) Improve systems for monitoring pupils who are not attending classes.
- (k) More support for pupils with their homework.
- (I) More information to parents and carers around their child's progress in school and the curriculum they are following.
- (m) Stretching the most able pupils in school.
- (n) More training opportunities for staff working with children who have additional support needs.
- (o) Address staffing gaps in the school.
- (p) Promote the positive work that the school does and the positive experiences young people have in the school.
- (q) More parental involvement including family learning opportunities.

5. What happens next?

We are reviewing the feedback from this survey along with other selfevaluation, including a pupil survey this term and surveys for departments and staff in term four.

This self-evaluation will support the identification of priorities and actions for the 2024/25 School Improvement Plan and improvements more broadly in the school.
