
If you want to go a bit further, as you go try to be aware of how many different things you can see and hear.



The Big Brae Bake-Off!

The Modern Foreign Languages department is giving you an exciting opportunity to enter our German and French bake-off challenge.

Why not try out a traditional dish to celebrate sustainability week?

Cooking is a really fun way to learn about foreign languages, cultures and cuisines and you and your family get to eat what you have cooked!

Step 1: decide what you want to cook and identify a French or German recipe you would like to follow.

Step 2: gather all the ingredients and equipment you will need. An idea would be to label the ingredients you are using in French or in German.

Step 3: Use the ingredients you have to make your dish and describe how you are cooking it step by step. Taking photographs as you go along would show how you went through the process. You can also make a video of the food you are preparing but we ask that you only use your voice and do not appear in the video (see example below):


