NUMERACY & MATHEMATICS

Money: Money up to £20.00 - know different ways of making up £1, £5, £10 Give change up to £10 using mental and written strategies.

Paying for goods using cards and digital technology.

Area: Using square grids to estimate then measure the areas of a variety of simple 2D shapes to the nearest half square.

Creating shapes with a given area to the nearest half square using square tiles or grids.

Recognising that different shapes can have the same area (conservation of area).

Measure - knowing the correct units of measure to use. Eg cm for length, litres for capacity.

HEALTH & WELLBEING

Learning about living things and where they come from and how they grow, develop and are nurtured. Link this to looking at suitable foods for different age groups from babies to the elderly.
