Financial Help for Parents/carers. There is a lot to worry about as we head into the winter months. However Grants are available for school meals and clothing. Guidance and an application form can be found on Shetland Islands Council's website. The direct link is:

EMA, Bursaries and Financial Support – Shetland Islands Council

All pupils in P1-5 are automatically entitled to free school meals.

If you meet the eligibility criteria below and have a child in early years or P1-5 you should still submit an application in order to receive the Clothing Grant, Free School Milk or <u>Free School Meal Holiday Support</u>. The Scottish Government provide additional funding to schools based on pupils who are entitled to Free School Meals.

Children attending Early Learning and Childcare settings, including Entitled 2's will also be eligible for the universal entitlement.

A Clothing Grant is a grant awarded to children from families on a low income to help towards the cost of clothing and footwear.

The current Clothing Grant awards are as follows:









- Early Years £100
- Primary £120
- Secondary £150

Pupils who turn 16 on or before 30th September will not be eligible for a Clothing Grant but should apply for an <u>Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA)</u> instead. These pupils will still be eligible for Free School Meals, if they meet the criteria.
