#### Some reminders:

Scarlett fever is doing the rounds on Shetland at the moment. It is a common infection in children caused by the group A Streptococcus virus. Scarlet fever can caused the following symptoms:

Headache, sore throat, high temperature and raised pick purple spots that join up to produce a skin rash which feels like sandpaper.









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Although scarlet fever is usually a mild illness, in very rare occasions the bacteria can enter the bloodstream and cause a more serious invasive illness.

Health advice can be found on NHS inform.

Children with suspected scarlet fever should be assessed by a health professional.

Children and adults with suspected scarlet fever should not attend school or work until at least 24hrs after they commenced appropriate antibiotic treatment.

Morning drop off: Please do not drop your school age children off before 8.45 as the playground is not supervised. School starts at 9am for all school age children.

End of day pick up or bus changes: We often have to hold the buses up because a child tells us that arrangements for pick up are different. Whatever the normal arrangements for pick up are, we assume will happen every day-unless the parent phones, emails in or writes in the diary to let us know there is a change for that day. We will not let a child go until we are sure of what the arrangements are.

**Absence:** please notify the school of absence by phoning in the morning before 9.15. An absence request form should be complete for any planned absence - such as holiday. This is available on the school blog or from the office

**Headlice:** We have had several cases of these which is no surprise now that children are back together. Headlice are very hardy creatures who love long, clean hair, so the best way to prevent is for **long hair to always be tied back in school** and for weekly wet combing of hair.
