Industrial action is planned by some teaching unions for tomorrow, Tuesday 10th, so as you know school will be closed to primary aged children but Nursery will be open as usual and NOOSC will be open from 9am to 4.30pm for any one needing child care. Swimming starts for Tammie Norris and Orca class tomorrow (if industrial action does not take place) otherwise

The Sheltand Lost Songs Project starts today with Mareel class for the next 4 weeks- this is a project run by TVV2. The project has local culture at its heart with 'lost songs' taking centre stage. The tutors are researching local songs no longer commonly known and it will hopefully act as a springboard for new song- writing or visual depictions of the story of people behind the song.

The AI project with Draatsi class. The children continue to work with the Children's Parliament on Artificial Intelligence and Human Rights, taking part in missions and investigations along with 3 other schools across









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Scotland. This project will contribute to the Scottish Government's new AI strategy with the vision for Scotland to become a world leader in the development and use of trustworthy, ethical and inclusive AI.

Winter illness: We are now in that time of year when many illness and respiratory infections, including covid and scarlet fever are doing the rounds. As a general rule of thumb if your child is unwell or has a temperature please keep them at home until they feel better or 48hrs if they have been sick. Our aim is to not spread infection to other children and to school staff as there is very little relief staff available and we really do not want to have to shut classes due to staff shortages. Eating well and getting enough sleep and exercise all helps keep the immune system as healthy as possible. We will also be reminding children about good handwashing and respiratory hygiene (catch it, bin it) Please can you reinforce this at home too.

Morning drop off: Please do not drop your school age children off before 8.45 as the playground is not supervised. School starts at 9am for all school age children.

End of day pick up or bus changes: Whatever the normal arrangements for pick up are, we assume will happen every day- **unless the parent phones**, **emails in or writes in the diary to let us know there is a change** for that day. We will not let a child go until we are sure of what the arrangements are.

Absence: please notify the school of absence by phoning in the morning before 9.15. An absence request form should be complete for any planned absence – such as holiday. This is available on the school blog or from the office
