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**High Praise for the school**: Recently a Literacy advisor visited the school to review the impact of a year-long writing project that some classes had been involved in and she was very complimentary of the progress that has been made.

"It was great to see such a fantastic reading culture in the class. The children were able to use the well-kept library independently and some children explained the colour coding system to me. Accelerated reading seems to be working well. It was lovely to see some new books in the library which were recently purchased. The writing bundle has been implemented well in the class and the children knew exactly what their individual targets were. Fantastic teaching and learning going on and a very high standard of writing being produced by the engaged and motivated class" and about ELC she said "The established ELC staff have lovely, nurturing interactions with children. It was great to see free flow play between indoors and outdoors working so well"

Well done to all staff and children - it is great to see your hard work recognised.

Pupil Council have been canvasing their class mates for ideas on how we could improve the playground. They have been sharing some possible ideas for play equipment to see what is the most popular. So far a tunnel and wobble board are the most popular option across classes. The next steps will be to get some quotes to see if we have already raised enough money or need to do more. Pupil Council have also been looking at the first steps to becoming a Rights Respecting School. So far one class is very conversant with the United Nations Convention for the Rights of the child and so Pupil Council are looking at ways to help more children know about their rights and how to respect the rights of others.
