

FAIR ISLE WEATHER FORECAST



GENERAL SITUATION Friday 15th December 2023

Pressure is high across Biscay and low north of Iceland with a strong, moist, mild south-westerly airflow pushing a warm front towards northwest Scotland. This clears Shetland on Saturday with the cold front sinking south over the Northern Isles on Sunday. With low pressure then dominant to the north leaving the Northern Isles in a progressively colder and occasionally strong west to north-westerly airflow, possibly turning northerly and easing later in the week.

OUTLOOK FOR THE WEEKEND

Temperatures 8° to 10°Celsius by day, around 7° overnight.

FRIDAY 15th: A cloudy showery start becoming mainly dry and brighter before clouding over as F5 WSW winds back SSW with outbreaks of rain later, heavy during the evening. Mild, but SW winds strengthening F6-7. Lighter rain overnight.

Sea State: Very rough with a 6 metre W'ly wind

swell. Moderate inshore east of Shetland with a 2 metre SW'ly wind swell.

SATURDAY 16th: F5-6 WSW winds with outbreaks of rain, heavy at times. Further occasionally heavy rain overnight. **Sea State:** Very rough with a 6 metre W'ly wind swell. Moderate inshore east of Shetland with a 2 metre SW'ly wind swell.

SUNDAY 17th: Rain soon dying out then a mainly dry, brighter day with F5 W winds and a few showers.

Sea State: Rough with a 4 metre W'ly wind swell. Moderate inshore east of Shetland with a 2 metre SW'ly wind swell.

FORECAST FOR NEXT Temperatures starting 7° or 8° Celsius by day 5° overnight, gradually turning cooler and perhaps wintry by the end of the week.

MONDAY 18th: Cloudy with patchy rain then scattered showers. Fresh SW wind veering fresh to strong WSW. **Sea State:** Rough with a 3 to 4 metre W'ly wind swell.

TUESDAY 19th: A mainly dry morning with chance of rain later. Fresh to strong W winds. **Sea State:** Rough with a 4 to 5 metre W'ly wind swell. Moderate inshore east of Shetland with a 2 metre SW'ly wind swell.

WEDNESDAY 20th – CHRISTMAS EVE 24th: Some early rain Wednesday then mainly dry but cloudy. Fresh to strong WNW winds easing for a while but then rest of the week unsettled and colder with rain or showers, perhaps falling as snow over hills and wintry down to lower levels. Occasionally strong NW to N winds easing bringing the risk of frost and ice. **Sea State Wednesday:** Very rough with a 6 metre W'ly wind swell. Moderate or rough inshore east of Shetland with a 2 to 3 metre SW'ly wind swell. Swell turning NW and easing next few days.
