
#### Fun Times!



Brodie gets his cake for pudding which went down a treat!





#### FAIR ISLE WEATHER FORECAST



#### **GENERAL SITUATION**

Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2024

With pressure low to the north and high to the south a strong, very mild west-southwest airflow covers northern Scotland. A cold front clears east this afternoon bringing a colder westerly airflow overnight. This becomes north-westerly during the weekend as low pressure transfers east into northern Scandinavia. A small low is forecast to track east close to Shetland on Monday leaving a lighter north to northeasterly airflow. With the next Atlantic depression predicted to run east across southern parts of the UK during next week the northeasterly airflow is likely to persist across the Northern Isles.

#### **OUTLOOK FOR THE WEEKEND**

Friday mild with 9° to 11° Celsius by day. Cooler overnight at 5°. The weekend colder, 4° or 5° by day 1° or 2° overnight.

**FRIDAY 2<sup>nd</sup>:** Mild and cloudy with rain or drizzle and F7 to gale F8 WSW winds. The evening clearer, cooler overnight with a few showers and F6-7 W winds.

**Sea State:** Mostly very rough with a 5 to 6 metre W'ly wind swell. Inshore east of Shetland moderate or rough with a 2 to 3 metre W'ly wind swell.

**SATURDAY 3<sup>rd</sup>:** Bright with showers, wintry at times. F7 to gale F8 W winds. **Sea State:** Very rough to high with a 5 to 7 metre W'ly wind swell. Inshore east of Shetland moderate or rough with a 2 to 4 metre W'ly wind swell.

**SUNDAY 4<sup>th</sup>:** Bright with scattered showers, some wintry. F6-7 WNW winds occasionally gale F8 easing W overnight. **Sea State:** High with a 6 to 8 metre W'ly wind swell. Inshore east of Shetland

moderate or rough with a 2 to 4 metre W'ly wind swell.

FORECAST FOR NEXT WEEK Temperatures 5° or 6° Celsius by day 1° or 2° overnight.

**MONDAY 5<sup>th</sup>:** Cloudy with rain soon arriving. Freshening SE winds becoming cyclonic variable then strong W later as rain clears. Risk of gales overnight. **Sea State:** Rough with a 3 to 4 metre W'ly wind swell. East of Shetland mostly moderate with a 2 metre N'ly wind swell.

**TUESDAY 6<sup>th</sup>:** Rather cloudy though mainly dry. Strong NW winds easing **Sea State:** Mostly rough with a 3 metre W'ly wind swell. East of Shetland mostly moderate with a 2 metre N'ly wind swell.

**WEDNESDAY 7<sup>th</sup> – SUNDAY 11<sup>th</sup>:** Showers and a fresh N wind Wednesday easing by Thursday. Friday and the weekend cool with a fresh NE wind and showers, some wintry.

Sea State Wednesday: Mostly rough with a 3 metre N'ly wind swell.
