


My Weekend

Florine's Fair Isle journal


Friday 8th March


ISLE NOTICES

FAIR ISLE WEATHER FORECAST



GENERAL SITUATION Friday 15th March 2024

As shallow low pressure continues northeast the moderate northeasterly airflow will freshen northerly. This eases on Saturday as pressure temporarily builds. A southerly airflow freshens overnight ahead of a front driven northeast by an Atlantic depression. The airflow veers south-westerly Sunday morning as the front clears Shetland. A new Atlantic low is forecast to swing northeast close to the British Isles early next week then cross Shetland as a filling feature midweek. Following this the Azores high briefly expends a ridge north-east across Scotland early Thursday. A predicted Icelandic depression then drives a front east overnight bringing a strong west veering north-westerly for Friday. A ridge may bring easing winds on Saturday with Sunday again unsettled as a frontal trough reaches northern Scotland.

OUTLOOK FOR THE WEEKEND

Friday and Saturday 6° Celsius by day, 3° overnight. Sunday milder with 8° and 6°.

FRIDAY 15th: Starting cloudy with showers, becoming drier and brighter through the afternoon. F5 NNE wind backing N. Mostly dry overnight with some clear spells.

Sea State: Moderate with a 2 metre N'ly wind swell.

wind easing and backing F3-4 E later freshening F5 SE. A cloudier night with rain reaching Fair Isle from the south later. **Sea State:** Moderate or rough with a 2 to 3 metre NNE'ly wind swell becoming E'ly.

SUNDAY 17th: A cloudy start with rain, this turning showery in the afternoon as F5-6 SE winds veer SSW. Some showers likely for the evening and overnight. **Sea State:** Rough with a 3 to 4 metre SE'ly wind swell.

FORECAST FOR NEXT WEEK

Temperatures around 8° Celsius by day, 6° overnight.

MONDAY 18th: Rather cloudy with chance of showers, perhaps more persistent rain later. Mainly fresh S winds.

Sea State: Rough to very rough with a 4 to 5 metre SE'ly wind swell.

TUESDAY 19th: Cloudy with scattered showers merging into persistent rain by evening. Fresh to strong SSE winds. **Sea State:** Rough with a 3 metre SE'ly wind swell.

WEDNESDAY 20th – SUNDAY 24th: Wednesday cloudy with rain then showers as fresh S winds ease before becoming a blustery NW. Thursday mainly dry with lighter winds but rain likely overnight as SW winds strengthen. Rain clearing to showers on Friday with a strong to gale W wind veering NW. Showers dying out Saturday as winds ease. Sunday unsettled with rain or showers.

Sea State Wednesday: Mostly moderate with a 2 metre SE'ly wind swell.
