I had a Super holiday and I'm looking forward to even more lambs!




My Trip to Scotland Mainland

Beachcombing news!

We found this stick in Hesti Geo at the weekend, which, upon closer inspection, appears to have been chewed by a beaver.

Martin Gray, a beachcombing expert from Orkney and David Steel (NatureScot reserve manager on the Isle of May) both agreed with the identification and pointed out the similarities to previous finds they have made on their respective islands. There are two species of Beaver (American and Eurasian) and it's possible that this branch had been chewed by either of them, although given the amount of driftwood that has been turning up after the run of south-easterly winds this winter, a European origin seems perhaps most likely (Martin mentioned that Orkney recently had its first European Beaver chewed stick, the others all having been American).



FAIR ISLE WEATHER FORECAST



GENERAL SITUATION

Friday 19th April 2024

The cold strong north-westerly airflow will gradually ease as low pressure over the northern North Sea moves away east. An anticyclone southwest of the British Isles then drifts in over the UK during the weekend, though a warm front brushing around its northern edge affects the Northern Isles on Sunday. While the centre of the large anticyclone drifts back west pressure remains high across the UK with a northerly airflow over NE Scotland. The weakening high is forecast to sink south midweek with a deepening depression near Iceland predicted to track southeast towards Biscay later in the week.

OUTLOOK FOR THE WEEKEND Temperatures Friday and Saturday 6° or 7° Celsius by day, 3° or 4° overnight. Sunday a milder 9° and 5°.

FRIDAY 19th: A scattering of showers, some wintry with sleet or hail. sunny spells between. A chilly F6-7 NNW wind easing F4-5 later. A cloudier though mainly dry night with winds falling light. **Sea State:** Mainly rough with a 4 metre NW'ly wind swell.

SATURDAY 20th: A cloudy dry start with F2-3 NNW winds backing S with drizzle and patchy low cloud pushing in from the west in the afternoon. Cloud and drizzle overnight. **Sea State:** Mainly moderate with a 2 metre NNW'ly wind swell.

SUNDAY 21st: Cloudy with patchy drizzle and a F3-4 SSW wind. **Sea State:** Slight to moderate with a 1 to 2 metre W'ly wind swell.

FORECAST FOR NEXT WEEK Temperatures 8° to 10° Celsius by day, 4° or 5° overnight.

MONDAY 22nd: Cloud and drizzle at first, the afternoon drier and brighter. Moderate NW winds. **Sea State:** Mostly moderate with a 2 metre NW'lv wind swell.

TUESDAY 23rd: Dry and bright with sunny spells later. A fresh NNE breeze. **Sea State:** Moderate with a 2 metre N'ly wind swell.

WEDNESDAY 24th – SUNDAY 28th: Freshening N winds and showers on Wednesday. Thursday into Friday drier as winds ease. Freshening E winds and further showers for the weekend. **Sea State Wednesday:** Moderate or rough with a 2 to 3 metre N'ly wind swell. **Dave Wheeler**
