

FAIR ISLE WEATHER FORECAST



GENERAL SITUATION

Friday 24th Mav

2024 During the next 24 hours a small shallow depression centred close to Northeast England is expected to drift across northern Scotland as a filling feature. A weakening frontal trough in the near-Atlantic pushes in across the British Isles during the weekend maintaining a moist southeasterly airflow. An Atlantic depression tracking east drives its fronts east across Scotland on Tuesday with the centre of the low tracking across the Northern Isles on Wednesday. As the now-filling depression continues east and pressure builds to the west a fresh to strong north to north-westerly airflow follows for Thursday and Friday. This eases over the weekend as a ridge topples south east across northern Scotland.

OUTLOOK FOR THE WEEKEND

Temperatures 12° during the day and 9° or 10° overnight.

FRIDAY 24th: A misty day with patchy drizzle, hill and coastal fog but perhaps turning drier and occasionally brighter later in the day. F3 ESE wind. Low cloud returning through the evening and overnight with fog and patchy drizzle. Sea State: Slight with a 1 metre NNE wind swell.

SATURDAY 25^h: Another day of fog and patchy drizzle

though for a short time the afternoon may brighten before mist, fog and drizzle returns. F3-4 SE wind. Sea State: Slight with a 1 metre SE wind swell.

SUNDAY 26th: Low cloud, mist and occasional drizzle. Fog at times. F3-4 ESE wind. Sea State: Slight with a 1 metre or less swell.

FORECAST FOR NEXT WEEK Temperatures around 14° Celsius by day, 9° overnight.

MONDAY 27th: Cloudy some brighter or sunny spells later. Light winds...

Sea State: Slight with a 1 metre SE wind swell.

TUESDAY 28th: Rather cloudy with rain at times. Freshening SE wind backing E later.

Sea State: Slight with a 1 metre W wind swell becoming 1 to 2 metre SE.

WEDNESDAY 29th - SUNDAY 2nd: Wednesday cloudy with rain turning to showers as fresh occasionally strong E winds back NE to N. Thursday cloudy with showers and fresh N to NW winds. Friday and the weekend drier and brighter with easing winds. Sea State Wednesday: Moderate with a 2 metre W wind swell. Slight east of Shetland with a 1 metre SE wind swell.

May 2024 Fair Isle weather update

Until a couple of days ago it looked as though May 2024 may have been drier than average with near- average hours of sunshine. That changed this last 48 hours with an additional 28.8mm of rain.

So far this month's provisional data shows we have had 140.1 hours sunshine (70.7% of the 1976-2000 mean) and rainfall of 43.4mm (104.8% of the 1974-2000 mean). Fog has occurred on 13 days so far (normally 9, but 20 in May 1979 and 22 May 1981, double figures not uncommon).

However, while maximum and minimum temperatures are nothing exceptional the mean monthly temperature for May 2024 is. The 1974-2000 May mean monthly temperature is 7.6°. This month it stands at 10.1°, making this the warmest ever May on Fair Isle (records began 1974. The June mean daily temperature is 9.7° that of July 11.4°.
